Guest Speaker - Ben Yengi AO

Chairperson Chandra Sluggett introduced our guest speaker Ben Yengi. Ben was born in the Sudan and came to Australia as a refugee in 1965. A one-time resident of Unley, Ben is still a Sturt supporter.

He used maps of Africa and the Sudan (which is about the size of Western Australia) to describe where he was born and educated and the countries through which he travelled during his time of suffering as a refugee. The Sudan has experienced many years of civil war between the Muslim north and the Christian south, struggles motivated by a desire for the oil and agricultural wealth of the south. Ben was sponsored to come to Australia by Alan Hutton, a Rotarian from Mitcham.

Ben trained as a teacher in Adelaide and for around 20 years worked with aboriginal people in both urban situations and in outback Australia. In particular he worked with the Pitjantjatjara people, whose language he learned, and travelled with them to many places here and overseas as an interpreter to explain their history and culture.

A Rotarian for eight years, he was the coordinator of the distribution of 20,000 recycling crates in the Tea Tree Gully area. Some people left Rotary after this project!! Ben was attracted to Rotary by his desire to contribute something to the community and to make a difference in people's lives.

Ben, a recipient of the Order of Australia, is currently working in Youth Entrepreneurship with Playford Council in the Elizabeth area in particular. In closing, using his African drum, Ben led members and guests in the enthusiastic singing of a song from his native land. Great fun!

Rotarians Celebrate RYLA's Worldwide Success

More than 400 Rotarians and invited guests joined RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe at the University of Western Australia's Octagon Theatre in Perth on 16 January to mark the success of the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) program.

Born some 44 years ago in Brisbane, Queensland, as a "gundoo" — an aboriginal word meaning "festival" or "fun together" — RYLA aptly returned to the land of its origin as the centrepiece of an RI presidential celebration.

In a speech full of praise for the resourcefulness of Australian Rotarians, President Majiyagbe addressed the need for leadership training for young people in a world of increasing complexity. "Every year, thousands of young people participate in RYLA events sponsored by Rotary clubs and districts — and everyone involved makes important contributions to this beneficial program," he said.

"Through RYLA, Rotarians mentor young leaders. In turn, these young leaders bring a fresh burst of enthusiasm to a Rotary club by supporting club projects, providing new ideas for service, and strengthening or starting Interact and Rotaract clubs."
