Guest Speaker

Jim Newall introduced guest speaker **Anne Henderson** whose area of expertise is in the provision of aged residential care. She has worked in the aged care industry for 30 years and managed aged care facilities for almost 20 years. She has worked for Eldercare for 10 years and is currently based at The Lodge facility at Wayville.

Nationally, there are about 3,000 aged care facilities looking after approx. 143,000 residents. The SA market represents about 10% of the market both in terms of residents and facilities. Aged care is the ninth largest employer in the country.

Eldercare is one of the larger aged care facility organisations, operating nine facilities in this State with a current total of 680 beds. There are also 182 retirement villages and units. Staffing levels are about 700 plus volunteers and the operating budget is in excess of \$32m pa.

Some 50% of residents in aged care facilities are over 85 years of age, 72% are female and 5.5% of the population over 65 years of age is housed in aged care facilities.

Many types of care and facilities are available, at differing rates of accommodation charges.
