Greg Love's Presentation

Preparations for the ATHENS 2004 Paralympic Games are entering the home straight. On 17 September 2004, the Opening Ceremony will begin at the Athens Olympic Stadium for what is the greatest sporting event in the world, in size and importance, for persons with a disability.

Athens will host 4000 athletes from some 140 countries, 3000 Media representatives, 1000 technical officials, 2000 team escorts, and roughly 2500 official guests. In addition, there will be about 35,000 people working for the Paralympic Games. Of these, 15,000 will be Volunteers.

Sports: The Games program includes nineteen sports. Fourteen of these (Wheelchair Tennis, Table Tennis, Riding, Sailing, Wheelchair Basketball, Swimming, Wheelchair Fencing, Volleyball (Sitting), Cycling, Football 5-a-side and 7-a-side, Shooting, Athletics, Judo and Archery) are equivalent to those in the Olympic Games. Four are exclusively Paralympic sports (Boccia, Goalball, Weightlifting, Powerlifting, and Wheelchair Rugby).

My role as the World International Wheelchair Basketball Federation Vice President is to act as a game commissioner - one of three. We will supervise from the technical point of view, 65 games of wheelchair basketball over 11 days.

They are 12 men's teams and 8 women's teams. The Australian women, the Gliders, are the defending silver medallists from Sydney and the men hold the "tin" medal for coming 4 th.

After the Games, on my way home, I get back to grass root development of the sport by running a three-day technical clinic in Manila. So President Ron, please excuse me till Oct the 12th.
