Darrol Foote introduced Kali Haywood who is our sponsored Indigenous Medical Student. Kali is studying at Adelaide University and is currently in 5th year. She is married with 4 children and currently has her father living with her as well. She is doing a placement with anesthetic medicine currently and will do a GP placement as well as geriatric medicine. Kali decided to do medicine after leaving school in Year 11 and then working in childcare in a centre at Port Adelaide.

It was while she was in the Early Learning program with the Department of Education that Kali thought about a career in medicine. She is enjoying the course and looking forward to working in the medical field as a GP in an Aboriginal Community or Health Centre any where in the state. She has a very supportive husband that has helped her during her course. She has introduced Indigenous Health to the curriculum at the University. There are only 57 Indigenous doctors in Australia currently.

We look forward to seeing Kali on a regular basis.

Guest Speaker

Shelia Evans introduced Linda Matthews who is the Commissioner of Equal Opportunity (OEO) in South Australia. Linda gave an excellent summary of what the Office Of Equal Opportunity (OEO) is responsible for, including allegations of unfavourable treatment with grounds defined by law being race, physical or intellectual impairment, sex, age, marital status, sexuality, pregnancy, harassment and victimisation.

Linda gave quite a few examples of the extremes that her office has to deal with from the accepted and the unaccepted. Other areas that were interesting to hear the equal opportunity plays an important part in are the areas of provision of goods and services, accommodation where discrimination can take place, eg same sex couples looking for rental accommodation.

Linda's talk was very enlightening and quite topical. I am sure it has made a lot of the members think about our behaviour and how situations may be interpreted. I feel as the Editor of the Bulletin I could say respect for each other as individuals is what we need to embrace to help this office decrease it's workload.
