# Club Assembly

### International Committee - Greg Love:

The Committee has not met since 7<sup>th</sup> of December and under normal circumstances I would have had little to report so early in the New Year. Since that time however the Asian Tsunami Disæter has struck the Indian Ocean ring of nations with unprecedented loss of life and property.

The Rotary Board meeting of last week asked the Committees to review their budgets to see how we as a Club can respond. In that regard could International Committee members meet with me this evening briefly?

Lions East Timor Dental: I spoke to Dr Richard Slater today about the project that we committed too but he has found the funding from another source. I have asked him to come and visit with the International Committee later in the year to detail to us their next project in East Timor.

Responding to a question from the floor regarding the Book Sale and asking if the funds have been allocated, Greg Love indicated that this would be implemented ASAP.

### **Community Committee – Laurie Madigan:**

Over the last two months, the Committees main focus was the Christmas Carols at the Rotunda, held on 12 December 2004.

The Carols was an enjoyable evening and the general feedback on the event indicated that it was successful. In particular, the performance by the Australian Army Band, Australian Girls Choir and Soloist ensured that the evening went smoothly.

The total expenditure in relation to the event was just less than \$2,500. After taking into account a \$1,750 grant from the City of Unley, total cost to the Rotary Club of Unley was about \$700. This compares to an initial budget of \$3,000. At this point, I would like to thank the members of the Committee as their efforts ensured costs were minimised. As well, I would like to thank everyone within the Club who assisted in the distribution of flyers and on the evening. In the near future, the Committee will give consideration to the 2005 event.

Prior to Christmas, the Committee made a donation of \$500 to the Salvation Army as a contribution towards Christmas Hampers. As well, 140 Christmas cakes were provided to Meals on Wheels to be included in their Christmas Hampers at a total cost of \$616.

The Committee is currently considering numerous requests for donations. Further, the Committee has agreed to make available \$1,000 towards the Clubs donation in relation to the tsunami disaster.

### **New Generation Committee – Joan Reed:**

The National Youth Science Forum was held in January 2005 in Canberra our candidate Katrina Turci attended and we will be contacting her shortly to ask her to attend to give our club her report. Joe Rafalowicz, who was a Year 11 student from University Senior College who received financial support to attend the Australian delegation to the 37<sup>th</sup> Annual The Hague International Model United Nations forum held in The Hague in the Netherlands also in January 2005, will be invited to attend to feedback his experience to the club. Joe was one of 17 students selected Australia wide to attend this conference. It attracted approximately 4000 other delegates from over 90 countries. Also in January 3 students from the Mitcham Girls high school attend the Siemans Science experience. I will wait for feedback from these participants.

On Saturday night the 15<sup>th</sup> of January I was at the airport to welcome back Jess Henderson from her exchange trip to Brazil. President Ron was also there. This coming Saturday I will be farewelling Melissa Mathie our outgoing student who is off to Germany for her 12 month exchange. I attended her farewell at her home last Saturday.

As the RYLA administrator I attended the meeting of the RYPEN/RYLA committee on Sunday the 16<sup>th</sup> of January. In the year 2005 our club is co-coordinating the RYLA conference and in the next few months our committee will be looking for willing helpers with this event. Issa Alsen our current student was sponsored to go on the Roundabout tour in Queensland during December; Cost \$420. The New Generation committee has looked at its budget and is pleased to be able to commit \$1,000 towards the Tsunami Disaster

### **TSUNAMI DISASTER**

Tsunami Recommendations (These were distributed to members):

### Pre-amble:

- 1. England and Europe are supporting Sri Lanka. India and Thailand are independent.
- 2. Australian Government are supporting Indonesia.
  - 2.1 It is our nearest neighbour.
  - 2.2 Largest death toll, and hardest hit.
  - 2.3 Politically prudent.
- 3. Some people and members want to support certain countries, eg. Sri Lanka.
- 4. Rotary Australia

- 4.1 All districts donate \$20,000 each
- 4.2 Our district will donate \$20,000
- 4.3 Target of \$500,000
- 4.4 This is likely to be matched by AusAID
- 4.5 Tax deductible through Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) or our own club when it becomes eligible
- 4.6 No administration costs
- 4.7 All funds will be distributed through (RAWCS)
- 4.8 Short term firstly is to build temporary low cost shelters. In the long term:
  - Rebuild infrastructure and services.
  - Schools and hospitals.
  - Send trades people and Rotarians under RAWCS scheme 2 weeks at a time.
  - Donations in Kind (DIKS) equipment for hospitals and schools.
- 4.9 \$20,000 will build 230 shelters.
- 4.10 1 million people are homeless in Aceh.
- 4.11 Rotary talking with Trade Unions to identify a database of trades people who could help.
- 5. Rotary Foundation will shortly make projects available for clubs to sponsor as on-going projects with cash and labour.

### Following a vigorous discussion it was the following recommendation had the meetings support.

The Assembly recommends to the Board to approve that any club donations be divided as follows

- 20%to Sri Lanka
- 80%to the Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) in Indonesia.

### Other Business:

- 1. It was also discussed that the Club's meeting date of 15 February be transferred to the 18<sup>th</sup> to enable members to attend the Centenary Dinner at the Morphettville Racecourse Function Centre.
- 2. It was raised that it was felt the standard of the meals was not acceptable. This was passed on to Kaylene Kranz who is the catering officer
