Donald Gordon Emmett passed away on Saturday the 19th of February 2005 at the age of 79 years. Don was inducted into this club on the 24th May 1970 being almost 35 years service to the Unley Community, with the classification of "Industrial Building". He held many offices within the club and District.

Don's contribution to Rotary was awarded the Paul Harris Fellow on the 24th June 1997 in recognition of that wonderful service to the club and community.

Don together with Ray ran a well-respected building company during the 60's to the 80's and was highly regarded in the business world with their ability to erect quality commercial and industrial buildings.

Don suffered a major set back in the 80's when he was diagnosed with cancer and in typical "never say die bulldog fashion" refused to allow that terrible affliction to deter or dampen his mission in life. He battled that illness for 25years until it took him on Saturday the 19th

Don had an emotional and insatiable appetite for the conduct of the Thrift Shop. He attended Thrift Shop meetings until about October last year when his illness began to take its toll. When it became known to him that we were asked to surrender the lease at 170 Unley Road, he was so concerned about it's future. Don was worried about the Glen Osmond Road location and expressed his reservations during various phone calls he had with me personally. He was so relieved when he heard of the new location at 130 Unley Road.

Don loved his Rotary, his club and it's members and still talked Rotary, according to Shirley, almost right up until the day he passed away. She said the word Rotary bought a smile to his face in his dying days.

He was loved by the members particularly with, as has been affectionately described, "his wicked wit". Don did have a wonderful sense of humour and he tentered to involve everyone around him.

This club will sadly miss Don and his club associates. I am sure he will find relief from the notorious pain he suffered in the last weeks. Don's Funeral is on Wednesday the 23rd of February at Berry's Funeral Home at 3.30pm.
