Our Guest Speaker – Sue Miers

Chairperson Joan Reed introduced our guest speaker Sue Miers. Sue is the spokesperson for the National Organisation for Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and Related Disorders. This organisation was established in Adelaide in 1998 and is Australia's first support group for parents, carers and other people interested in Fetal Alcohol Syndrome. They provide support by phone and email to people Australia-wide and educate about alcohol and pregnancy through brochures that are aimed at primary prevention. They are very concerned about the lack of awareness of this disability at all levels both locally and nationally. They are a voluntary organisation and rely on donations to support their work, particularly with the printing of their brochures. Sue has a foster daughter with partial Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and through her personal encounters gave us a very detailed talk on this syndrome. This organisation works closely with the indigenous communities to educate them on this serious condition.
