# Report on the Whyalla Meeting on Wednesday 20th May - District 9500

Alex, Greg Issa and Kaylene attended this meeting, which was a joint meeting of the Whyalla and Whyalla Norrie clubs to introduce the American Indian GSE group to the Rotarians present. Over 90 people attended the meeting. There were many visitors who called in on their way to the conference. The GSE group had participated in visits and discussions with Aboriginal people from SA and NT. They reported that in some areas, particularly in the maintenance of the local language and literacy and numeracy. The GSE students presented their lives and their goals for their people in an inspiring manner. It was most interesting to hear that Casinos are the major employer of American Indians on their reservations. They run the casinos for the benefit of the tribes. The income from this provides the mainstay of employment in all areas. Gaming, hospitality, administration, maintenance etc. Many questions were asked about this, given the problems gambling causes in this country. The rules are different in USA, and I won't go into that now. It works for them. The GSE people were wonderful to meet and I was pleased that I was able to attend this meeting. I thank Alex for all the work he did to get it organized for us. Issa was able to speak her tongue to a gentleman from Finland, and they had a good ole "chin wag" which was another bit of Oz she learnt. There were other Exchange students there that she caught up with. All in all an educational fun fellowship evening.

I am pleased to report that confirmation of the transfer of funds to the Rotary Club of Dili for the Ailue East Timor Milk Project has been confirmed. The funds were raised from the Book Sale,

We have informed Brian Ross National Director of Mercy Ships re the Sri Lanka Fishing Boat Project that we have funds for one boat and that when promised donations from our members come to hand we will be able to purchase a second boat.

Brian e-mailed to us the following "This is great news, please pass onto your club members our appreciation in providing these funds to purchase two fishing boats motors and fishing nets. What I will try to do for your members is to obtain photos on the hand-over when the boats, motors and nets when they are made available so members can see where their money has been spent and also that they feel part of this relief effort.
