She has been instrumental in getting together some netball ms and fundraising to obtain uniforms for them. This has proven to be very popular with the youth of Whyalla.

In accepting her award Kelly expressed her thanks the wonderful support she has received from her husband and members of the Whyalla Police department.

From the District Governor's Newsletter

Bushfire Recovery

A number of clubs have sent teams to Port Lincoln to assist farmers with clearing burnt sheds, barns and fence lines and erecting new ones. Some stayed on after the conference to assist as well. I am very proud of your efforts, in what are often very emotional circumstances, as local landholders desperately try and reestablish their lives and livelihoods for their families.

Fund raising is also still going strong. The GSE team from Scotland raised \$5,000 from its presentation meetings and presented this to PE Ron Carey of the RC Port Lincoln at their farewell dinner. The raffle at the DG's banquet was so successful that the District Secretary had to scrounge Port Lincoln on the Saturday night for more raffle tickets. Not an easy task in a small town with the shops shut! However a local hotel came to the rescue. We are very grateful to the team for this initiative and their request to see the devastation at first hand whilst they were in Port Lincoln. Each team member as a result of the experience put in \$50 towards the appeal.

So many clubs and other organisations have donated so much money that the RC Port Lincoln has exceeded its fund-raising target for the two water take-up points at Port Lincoln and Cummins. These will be two large water towers with the Rotary symbol proudly displayed on the side. The club has now extended its campaign to the purchase of a water bombing aircraft to be permanently located at Port Lincoln. One Adelaide-based 4WD club wanted to get into the Rotary spirit and offered the \$10,000 it had raised to the RC Port Lincoln. However it thought Rotary and Lions was one and the same organisation and sent the cheque to Lions International instead! However the two organisations have sorted it out and the cheque will be forwarded to Rotary.
