ROTARY CLUB OF UNLEY 70TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATORY DINNER

The Major Projects Committee proposed in September 2003 that the Club hold a celebration to mark both its 70th anniversary (the Club was chartered on 17/4/35) and the centenary of Rotary. The Board agreed and a dinner at the Adelaide Hilton was booked for Saturday 9th April 2005.

The Governor, Her Excellency Marjorie Jackson-Nelson accepted an invitation to be guest of honour (but was ill on the occasion and was substituted by the Deputy Governor Bruno Krumins and his wife Dr. Dagmara Krumins). It was also decided to hold a silent auction on the evening. Submissions were made to determine which charity would benefit from the auction proceeds and the proposal by Maeve Swinden that it be for refurbishment of the Unley Senior Citizens Centre was chosen by members at a Club meeting. Advance notice of the dinner was sent to metropolitan and country 'related' clubs. Final invitations were mailed out in early 2005 and included:

It was hoped attendance would exceed 300. Final numbers were 234 (there being 'competition' from two District Conferences and the major District 100th celebrations). David Middleton mailed out over 300 letters seeking donations for the silent auction.

The highlights of the evening were:

The silent auction raised \$3522 net and there was a loss on the dinner of \$1321 (within the 'up to \$2000 subsidy' approved by the Board. In all the evening was rated a great success; the food, service and venue were very good, and all ran to schedule with David Middleton as an excellent M.C.
