From the DG's Newsletter

RYLA

The next RYLA camp will be held at Nunyara Belair 18-24 July. It is aimed for 18-25 year olds and Rotarian family members are eligible. This is a great leadership-training course but applicants need to be encouraged to attend. Often the applicants are university students or people in the first stages of their career and a week out of their lives seems a long time. However, they can be guaranteed this will be one of the best experiences of their lives, which will help them enormously in their career advancement. Employers have a lot of respect for RYLA graduates and the graduates themselves realise the enormous self-confidence they gain from the skill development they receive during the week. Every club should aim to nominate at least one person for the course.

One of the graduates Emily Rogers of St Peters has just returned from the Rotary sponsored Centenary trip to the 90th Anniversary of the Gallipoli landing. The team of 26 RYLA graduates from districts in Australia and New Zealand spent 15 days in Turkey hosted by Turkish Rotary and Rotaract. The status of the team was such that the two Rotarian team leaders sat on the platform with the Australian and New Zealand Prime Ministers and Prince Charles for the Dawn ceremony. Emily is willing to speak to clubs on her experience. Some clubs have already booked her. Emily is a third year medical student so will need to fit in speaking engagements with her studies. However with patience on the part of clubs, she hopes to fulfil requests.

New Clubs

A committee has been established to investigate the establishment of a new club at Seaford in Adelaide's south. We are looking to establish a new kind of club that perhaps meets on the weekend with partners and children welcome. Seaford is a new rapidly growing community in a typical mortgage belt setting with most of the workers working outside of the town.

At the same time it is hoped to combine the strategy to boost the membership of four Southern clubs at Reynella, Noarlunga, Noarlunga East and McLaren Vale. McLaren Vale went through the trauma of losing a number of members this year but has picked itself up with a membership growth strategy and has already inducted a number of new members. Mildura is exploring the possibility of a new club across the river in NSW around Gol Gol and a Probus club at Ouyen.
