Bob Laws was the Sergeant this evening. Ken Haines won the wine and Ken Daly won the Lucky Square

Guest Speaker: Bob Ward [President Elect Port Pirie] "Sister Club Projects in the Philippines"

Chairperson Bob Mullins introduced Bob Ward. Bob Ward has been a member of the Pt Pirie club for 10 years or so and the Pt Pirie club has 54 members. Bob is married the Bernice and they have 4 boys who are all married and they have 9 grandchildren. He is also a member of the 9500 Youth Exchange committee. Bob has recently returned from the Philippines and he is going to talk about the projects that they have in progress in their Sister City Rotary Club of Dau is in Angelus City, which is in the Northern Philippines.

Port Pirie first became involved in the early 1990's with approximately 15 of their members making a yearly visit to the region. They have set up a sewing machine school to train the young girls so they can gain employment to support their families. Since the program began approximately 4000 have gone through the training with about 95% being successful getting work. On their recent trips they found that out of the 19n machines that were there only 7 were still working so they are looking at ways of obtaining more machines for the future. The classes run for a 4-week period with about 30 students going through. These courses are run every 6 weeks, and there is a graduation ceremony at the end of each course.

Other projects that they have been involved in are furnishing the school with desks and chairs, so that the children do not have to sit on the floor for schooling. Also they are investigating the issue of the drinking water. They have a very large rainfall but very little drinking water due to the contamination in the atmosphere so they are looking at rainwater tanks with various options e.g. aboveground or belowground. They are also having an exchange program for teachers with the first one occurring in a few months time with a teacher coming here for a 3-month period.

This project has proven to be a very rewarding one and all members who have gone over has describe it as a life changing experience not just for there members but also the Rotary club of Dau with some of there members coming over for the club's changeover in July.
