Guest Speakers

Greg Love spoke on his and President Kaylene's trip to the 96th Annual Conference in Chicago USA. It was an important conference as it was in the 100th year of Rotary International celebrations. Greg and Kaylene had a stop off at Winnipeg Canada as well where they caught up with friends and also visited the Winnipeg Rotary Club. The Winnipeg Club was the first rotary club every established outside of Chicago and the club was established in 1910.

At the conference there were participants from 150 nations. 40,500 attendees. Everything was well organised even down to transport of 9 bus routes between the convention centre and hotels etc. At the Gala dinner the then President Glenn E Estess 2004/2005 introduced president elect for 2006/07 President William B Boyd of the Rotary Club of Pakurange, Auckland NZ along with incoming President Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammer of the Rotary Club of Goteborg, Sweden. MC for the Gala Dinner was Roger Climpson of the Rotary Club of Lane Cove NSW. President Stenhammer also spoke at the presentations briefly on what his visions were for Rotary International during the next 12 months. He is not looking to reinvent the wheel.

Some of the presentations/speakers during the conference were:

- Entrepreneur and philanthropist Ted Turner gave a keynote address
- Nobel Peace prize laureate Wangari Mathai of Kenya and addressed the 4th Plenary Session.
- Nepalese Rotaractors who climbed Mt Everest and hoisted the Rotoray Flag on the summit.
- Polio Plus speakers were Dr Jon-Week Lee Director General WHO. Julie Gerberding Director of the Centres for Disease Control
 and Prevention and Rima Seleh, deputy executive director of UNICEF. The thrust of their presentation was to continue to commit
 with RI to wipe out Polio through out the world.

Joan Reid, Jill Reynolds and Martin Cooper also gave us a review of the RYLA camp held at Belair last week and the RYLA Graduation Dinner held at Ayers House last Saturday 23/7/05.

Joan spoke about the attendees when they arrived how they all had scared looks on their faces and how by Saturday night at the dinner they were completely different people. Full of confidence and ready to face any challenge.

The camp was well organised and a great location. The camp was for 18 to 25 year olds. There were many different activities during the week and the theme of the camp was centred on a monopoly board with all attendees playing different characters.

There were many speakers and sessions during the week.

Sharon Schubert, Director of White Lady (a distant relation to Ron) spoke on changing lives and her theme was known as "Success Express". This theme was then also used during the week in various activities. There were directors' and personal sessions held during the day as well. On Monday night there was a getting to know each other night and the way that these kids opened up to Joan, Jill & Martin during the week was very special to them.

Other sessions included public speaking – David Griggs. Balancing your life with topics including financial planning, how to prepare a CV, and how to conduct yourself at a job interview. Bob Carny a Vietnam Veteran, also spoke and told some home truths. On the last day the attendees discussed homeless people, drug & alcohol and aboriginal topics.

The dinner was nearly a disaster when the bus did not arrive to take 35 people to Ayers house. With a bit of improvising and some helpers they all arrived at Ayers House. Pianist Anne Lee, whom our club recently sponsored, played on an electric keyboard; a big change from playing in concert halls around the world. The food was great and all had an enjoyable night. The awardees' performance was brilliant and blew many people away.

The change a week can make and to see the transformation in these kids attitude and personalities from Monday to Saturday night was amazing.

A big thankyou must go to Joan, Jill & Martin for a fantastic effort and for taking time away from their families and work. You have done the Unley Club proud.
