I addressed this with the chef last night and he was unable to provide us with dessert. They however charged us at the usual price. It was the board's intention to have the style & price remain " as was" for 2 weeks with the club " picking up the tab" for the extra cost for those 2 meetings. The board will advise members of the options for future price and style of meal (number of courses etc) and seek feedback from all members making a decision. Kaylene will be speaking with the Catering Committee and the Sturt Club to resolve this before next week and will keep you informed.

Paul Howard at the request of President Kaylene spoke briefly on the youth exchange program within Rotary. Paul is on the District Committee for Youth Exchange and heads up the 6 clubs in our district. The youth exchange program is a very important part of Rotary and it is Rotary International's President, Carl Wilhelm's dream that every 17 year old in the world become an exchange student and this would greatly assist in world peace.

Sabine, our clubs current exchange student, will meet between 200-300 people during her stay in SA and it is important for us all to learn the different cultures of the exchange students and have a better understanding of them.

Under this scheme we also have outbound exchange students and after screening many applicants by Joan Reed, Melissa Mathie was chosen and is the club's sponsored outbound exchange student for 2005.

Paul stressed that every member take the time to get to know Sabine better not just on Tuesday nights, but inviting her on day trips if you are doing something interesting or just merely invite her to your home for a meal and a chat.

Bob Laws spoke about the importance and the enthusiasm that had been shown over the last 3 years in planting trees. There are 3 requirements of the members in planting trees: 1. Stuffing, 2. People to grow the trees on their property, and 3. Planting the trees.

Over the past 3 years the club has planted trees at Wellington and Bob has now located another property at Myponga. If any members can assist with any of the three required steps please speak to Bob Laws.
