## **EYRE PENINSULA BUSHFIRES**

#### INFORMATION CIRCULAR TO OUR DONORS AND SUPPORTERS

The last 11 months since the Eyre Peninsula bushfires have been very busy for our club and will continue to be so for some time to come. We wish to thank all of you for your generous donations and the time that has been freely given by so many.

Through our joint efforts we have raised approximately \$300,000 and at the time of issue of this information we are still aware of a number of donations that are still to come in.

The effort that our club has been involved in has been quite enormous since the early days after the fire and we have provided assistance to the community and victims in many ways. Some of this includes the refurbishment of the Wanilla Community Hail, native tree propagation and the volunteer program run at Nyroca Scout Camp.

One of the things that became evident very early in the recovery process was that a number of organisations and Government were doing a lot to help victims with cash handouts. In fact between the Government and charities some \$10m in aid was injected into our local community. In our view this satisfied the immediate need for direct cash requirements of victims.

Our club was concerned that very little was being done to provide infrastructure or other facilities to prevent and assist in providing various services in the event of a future disaster. Our club therefore resolved that we would concentrate on providing infrastructure that would be of long term benefit to the community.

In this regard we initially commenced with the idea of providing the community with 2 water bombing aircraft and in fact located 2 that we had under option. At that point the SA Government and CFS met with us and it seems that we may have been the catalyst in ensuring that the Government now has 2 water bombers stationed in Port Lincoln during the current fire season and will also do so in future years.

Our next job was to consider other infrastructure that could be installed.

As a result of this process it has been agreed that the following will be provided by our club: -

- 2 collapsible tanks and a trailer for movement to fire areas and to be used for refilling aircraft and ground units. Assistance with this has been provided by a Rotary matching grant for approximately A\$54,000.
- 2. Provision of a Dual cab truck fitted with a 1.5 tonne crane for use as a support vehicle to the above. Cost is approx \$80,000 of which wewill provide \$30,000 with IVIGA Insurance Brokers providing a matching amount of \$30,000. The balance will be paid by CFS.
- 3. Provision of 4 X 40,000 gallon fixed water storage tanks located at strategic air strips on Eyre Peninsula, being Cummins, Lock, Kimba and Cleve. Installed cost is \$44,000.
- 4. Provision of 2 mobile ex bulk tankers of 22,000 litre capacity to provide a resource for transport of water to fire or disaster sites. Cost is \$60,500.
- 5. Provision of a new shower and ablution block at Nyroca Scout camp. This facility has been used as volunteer camp and upgraded facilities are needed for the future. Cost is \$47,000 of which we are paying \$30,000, National Bank is paying \$10,000 and the Scout organisation is contributing \$7,000.
- 6. Provision of similar facilities at the Lions Hostel at North Shields. This facility was destroyed in the fire otherwise it would also have been used

as a volunteer base. We regularly have Rotary exchange students utilise this facility. Total rebuild cost is \$372,000 of which they have \$300,000 covered by insurance. We have agreed to support this rebuild to the extent of \$20,000 and National Bank are also matching this with a further grant of \$20,000.

After completion of the above we have some \$50,000 still to be committed. Negotiations have been underway for some time in connection with provision of an automatic weather reporting station to be installed on Flinders Island. Such a facility is essential in connection with early warning of weather and wind pattern changes that are essential to fire control. If negotiations can be completed this will utilise the balance of funds available.

We trust that you feel we have disbursed all of the donated funds in an effective manner. In our view we believe we have done exceptionally well in placing strategic equipment and infrastructure in place to stand the community in very good stead for any disaster that occurs in the future.

Once again, our sincere thanks for your support without which none of the above would have been possible.
