INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE: No report was tendered.

NEW GENERATION/VOCATIONAL REPORT: President Kaylene, Fellow Rotarians and Visitors. This year today has been disappointing with the lack of requests for sponsorship. In November 2005 we sponsored disadvantaged children to a live Magic Show. It was held in the Thebarton Theatre on Friday the 4th and 5th of November, and the children were supervised by various carers. We have received a letter of thanks and a calendar.

Police Officer of the Year 2005 - Posters printed and distributed to all Rotary Clubs and Local Government within SA as well as distribution by SAPOL. Nominations close on Friday 24th March with presentation of Award in Rundle Mail and at our evening dinner meeting on Tuesday 16th May (venue to be determined). Posters and information will be forwarded to country newspapers and radio stations later this week.

Campbelltown Shareskills Project - Interest from the original donation of \$20,000 is to be used for a project involving un-employed persons. Currently approx. \$3,000 is available. Further discussions to be held with Unley Library for possible repeat of the inaugural and successful program involving training of un-employed persons to use the Internet for job seeking, job applications and CV preparation. Discussions are also to be held with Salvation Army for a possible alternative project.

I am currently in possession of 3 applications for Students from Urrbrae who have shown a strong interest in the Health of the River System and hope my committee will endorse these sponsorships. RYLA and RYWELL and also due to be held in the near future and I am sure our club will be involved in sponsorship of these great events.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: A pizza evening was held for members who joined in 2004 and 2005 on 21 October to get feedback.
