Guest Speaker

Chairman David Middleton introduced <u>Ken Eustice</u> as our guest speaker. Ken has had a chequered career as a footballer in the SANFL, commencing with West Adelaide, progressing to Central Districts and ending his playing career with Glenelg under Neil Kerley. He was the 1962 Magarey Medallist.

He spent some 40 years in the motor trade business and also participated in other business ventures. He has reached the heights and has experienced the lows. At one time, he operated the most successful car dealership in the country.

He suffered financial setbacks leading to bankruptcy and bouts of severe depression with attendant black moods, anti-social attitudes and lassitude but with professional help, appropriate medication and the support of family, colleagues and friends, has taken great strides to rehabilitate himself. The depression is still there but much more under control than in earlier times.

As part of his recovery, he has put in words in the form of a published book his journey with depression and how he has sought to deal with it and to overcome it and enjoy a more balanced and settled lifestyle.

Being prepared to admit to suffering from depression is a major step in the process of managing the problem and overcoming it.
