# Announcements from President Stephen

- There will be a working bee at the Thrift Shop this Saturday morning to help clear the backlog of donated goods that need to be sorted and priced. Pres. Stephen asked for any Rotarians, other than those already rostered-on, who can help at all this Saturday morning to please come along and contribute as much time as they can. It was pleasing to see at least five Rotarians putting up their hands to volunteer. Partners of Rotarians are also very welcome.
- The Australian Bureau of Statistics has asked the club to help promote to the Unley community the importance and value of the upcoming census by distributing promotional material locally. This request will be passed on to the Community Service Committee for consideration.
- A letter has been received from the Royal Blind Society requesting financial support, a letter distributed via Charity Direct; this will also be passed on to the Community Service Committee. However, Pres. Stephen warned members of all committees to be wary of requests for donations received via professional fundraising organisations; a substantial percentage of donated funds can be retained by the fundraisers to cover administrative costs and profits, and it is better to donate directly to a charity or to contribute to a specific project to help those in need.
- Past District Governor Arthur Manser has decided to donate the surplus from the last District Conference at Broken Hill to the Australian Rotary Health Research Fund and to do so by donating \$100 in the name of each of the then Presidents of the 54 clubs represented at the conference. Pres. Stephen presented Past Pres. Kaylene with a certificate recognising the donation made to the ARHRF in her name.

# Club Assembly

Each of these reports outlined the committees' strategic objectives and plans for the next three years and more detailed plans for the current Rotary year. Budget submissions from each of the committees were to be discussed at this week's Board meeting.

The Thrift Shop Committee report was presented by Acting Chair, Pres. Stephen Westgarth. Pres. Stephen made an appeal for a Rotarian to volunteer to take on the chairmanship of the Thrift Shop Committee for this year; now that the work of the Thrift Shop is being managed by teams in the areas of Administration, Retail & Merchandising, Premises & Maintenance, Advertising & PR, and Supply, the duties of the chairperson mainly involve organizing and chairing committee meetings and preparing minutes and agendas.

Past Treasurer Alex Jonson presented the unaudited financial statements for the 2005-06 year and advised that total fundraising was down by about \$24,000 compared to the previous year, mainly due to higher expenses and the absence of the lease termination payout.

- The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life:

Asia: Countries include - China (excl Hong Kong, Korea, Malaysia, Mongolia, Pakistan, Philippines and Thailand.

Europe: Countries include - Albania, Azerbaijan, Croatia and Turkey.

Africa: Countries include - Algeria, Angola, Botswana, Cameroon, Egypt, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Libya and Rwanda.

North & Central America: Countries include - Guatemala, Mexico and Panama.

South America: Countries include - Brazil, Peru and Venezuela.

Pacific Region: Countries include - Cook Islands, Papua New Guinea, Fiji and Solomon Islands.

These projects are conducted through the leadership of volunteers, providing the knowledge and skills necessary to successfully conduct their responsibilities and allowing them to exchange ideas and know-how with other Rotarians.
