Guest Speaker

Stefan Borak introduced **John Kenneally** who with Tony McCarthy provides an entertaining breakfast program on Radio 891 each morning. Each has a love for music and managed to combine this with the development of their association with radio, becoming involved with music programming and culminating in an evening radio show, which eventually became a morning talk and music show. Very pleasing ratings are maintained and Radio 891 has a good market share. John is an avid reader with a voracious appetite for music.

John's grounding in the music industry began through his employment with The Muses store in Regent Arcade and, with a desire to move into the more creative side, he secured work as a music programmer at the ABC. The ABC of 20 years ago was a very different environment from the ABC of today. There were too many changes too soon, leading to some very poor programming choices by the ABC. As well, the ABC was required on Radio National of those days to broadcast Parliament so the programming was fragmented around the Parliament obligations.

John became the music director for 5AN at a time when a new broom was sweeping through the ABC. The ABC became a better place to be, but with 5AN becoming heavily focused on news and information, John's job as music director seemed to lose relevance as he found that he was music director of "All Talk 5AN". He progressed to producing Rex Leverington at night, then moved on to producing the Keith Conlon's program which was effectively current affairs radio.

Further changes within the ABC enabled John to develop his music knowledge and led to the association with Tony McCarthy with their own evening program in 2000. Their wide ranging brief was to talk about music and play whatever they wanted to play and to have fun. They have gone from strength to strength as The Bald Brothers with their morning time slot. This is John's 22nd year with the ABC. It is very supportive of its employees and is a great place to work.

John agreed with President Stephen's comment that the ABC gives its listeners their eight cents worth.
