- 4. The District Governor's October Newsletter is in and I thought I'd highlight a few matters raised by DG Bob Northcote.

4.1 TSUNAMI DISASTER FUNDS

The funds donated by clubs and the district (A\$58,000) for the Tsunami disaster have gone to the Gampong Anak orphans' village in Aceh and are being put to good use. The first families will move in this November, and the village will be officially opened by RI President Bill Boyd on December 4. They have decided to expand the project and establish a Rotary Youth Centre as well. As well as providing accommodation they will use the RYC as a base for educational and vocational programs and a call has gone out for Rotarians interested in teaching furniture making and art. 4.2 SOLAR WATER PURIFIERS

The Solar Water Purifier invented in SA was one of the features on Radio National recently and Rotary got high praise and publicity. The inventor from Thamesford was interviewed. It is also an entry in the New Inventors on ABC TV and will be shown on Wed 11 October at 8 pm. Also, Save Water Saves Lives has been invited to take the invention to an Aid Expo in Melbourne on Dec 6. And be aware that this great invention can be used as a basis for a TRF Matching Grant project.

Guest Speakers

Darrol Foote gave a very good summary on the work that Rotary does for PolioPlus, one of the Humanitarian projects within Rotary.

Polio is a highly infectious disease that primarily affects children under the age of three and can cause paralysis within hours. Before eradication efforts began in 1988, polio paralysed more than 1,000 children a day, which totalled about 350,000 children annually. The incidence of polio has since declined by more than 99 percent. Vaccinations easily can stave off polio. Vaccinations have prevented an estimated 500,000 children per year from contracting polio. A child can be protected against polio for as little as 60 cents (US) worth of vaccine. Only four countries are still polio endemic — an all-time low: Nigeria, India, Pakistan, and Afghanistan.

Rotary International is the spearheading member of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative and is the largest private sector donor. It has contributed more than US\$600 million to the polio eradication activities in 122 countries. In addition, tens of thousands of Rotarians have partnered with their national ministries of health, UNICEF, the World Health Organization, the U.S. Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, and with health providers at the grassroots level in thousands of communities. In the early 1980s, Rotary began planning for the most ambitious program in its history — to immunize all of the world's children against polio. The plan required collaboration with international, national, and local health agencies and took shape early in Carlos Canseco's year as RI President in 1984-85 when he appointed the Polio 2005 Committee. Dr. Canseco invited Dr. Albert Sabin, developer of the oral polio vaccine, to serve as a special consultant to the committee.

Rotary's pledge of US\$120 million to fund its PolioPlus program was announced in October 1985 at the 40th anniversary of the United Nations. This ambitious commitment electrified the global public health community. Within three years, Rotarians had more than doubled their fundraising goal, donating US\$247 million. By the time the world is certified polio-free, Rotary's contributions to the global polio eradication effort will exceed US\$600 million.
