Announcements from President Stephen

- 1. When DG Bob Northcote visited our club in September, he referred to a challenge he had made to the various groups of clubs in District 9520 to join forces to undertake an international project with a matching grant from The Rotary Foundation and a grant from the District Designated Fund. The presidents of the Group 6 clubs, in consultation with their Boards, are currently negotiating the selection of such a project. The proposed funding to be provided by the seven Group 6 clubs for the joint matching grant project is \$6,000 plus \$3,000 from The Rotary Foundation on the basis of 50 cents in the dollar; then the District Designated Fund would contribute \$2,000, which would be matched by The Rotary Foundation on a dollar for dollar basis. So the potential total value of funding available for the Group 6 project would be \$13,000, plus whatever the participating club in the recipient country contributes.
 - Our own International Committee is currently having discussions with a club in Chiang Mai, Thailand about a project to rebuild a children's day care centre in the village of Mae Sapok. International Committee Chairman John Peacham was in Chiang Mai and spoke to the club about two weeks ago, and Rotary Foundation Committee Chairman Mavis Martin will be seeing them in Chiang Mai this week. The International Committee will also be seeking a matching grant project to help alleviate poverty in India, using the money recently donated by Val Wasley. Both of these Unley club projects have been offered to the Group 6 presidents as options for the Group 6 matching grant project for this Rotary Year. I will keep you informed of progress.
- 2. I wish to inform members that the board positions of two Directors and the Secretary and Treasurer will become vacant on 30th June 2007 and that nominations for candidates for election to these positions will be received by Secretary Sheila Evans up to 8.00pm on Tuesday 21st November. An election to fill these positions will be held at the Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 5th December. Secretary Sheila Evans is eligible for re-election as is Treasurer David Payne. As Mavis Martin is completing the second year of Laurie Madigan's two-year term as a Director, she is eligible for election as a Director for a further two years in her own right. Bob Laws is in the second year of his two-year term as a Director and will retire from that position on 30th June 2007. This announcement will be printed in the bulletin from each week until nominations close.
- 3. We have received some promotional material from the organisers of the 2007 RI Convention in Salt Lake City, to be held from 17 to 20 June. For more detail see the following item.

Those of us who watched the program will now know that the information I gave you was incorrect, although a water filtration system certainly did appear. According to an email I've received from AG Judy McAdam, the genuine Rotary Solar Water Purifier will appear on this week's The New Inventors program at 8pm on ABC TV tomorrow (Wednesday) night.

Salt Lake City RI Convention - June 2007

The Rocky Mountain Rendezvous Aussies and Kiwis ... get behind Bill and Lorna

Salt Lake City is the venue for the next RI Convention, $17^{th} - 20^{th}$ June 2007. It is President Bill Boyd's Convention. As great supporters of ours, we now have the chance to support Bill and Lorna at `their' *Rocky Mountain Rendezvous*.

Salt Lake put up its collective hand after Cyclone Katrina devastated New Orleans. The Host Organising Committee, supported by civic and business leaders and their tourism bureau, are enthusiastic about the wonderful and affordable convention package that has been created.

In late July, I joined Rotarians from different countries in Salt Lake to meet with the Salt Lake organizers. Under the Chairmanship of New Zealand's Stuart Heal, we worked with the local Rotary leaders as part of President Bill's desire to promote his convention properly.

All questions and any doubts about Salt Lake City were answered in the most positive way. The Host Committee has prepared an entertaining range of activities, while the Salt Palace is a fine convention venue for the RI program itself. The city is a joy to visit ((and the Wasatch mountain range, site for the 2002 Winter Olympics, provides a stunning backdrop)).

Here are some of the pluses to enjoy in Salt Lake City next June:

- World Peace Symposium. This historic meeting will be held in the two days before the Convention and is accessible to all interested registrants and their guests
- Affordability. The convention package is great value, while the hotels have been secured at a 25% discount rate
- **Proximity.** There are many excellent hotels in the city, lots of those within easy walking distance of the Salt Palace convention venue. If you need transport, there are convenient trams and buses and they are free
- Safety. Salt Lake has wide streets and, with an open layout and attractive buildings, is a city that is both clean and family friendly. The local residents are welcoming and make the atmosphere pleasant for all visitors
- Climate. During June, the first summer month, the temperatures are not extreme and the humidity is low. With a dry heat, the days average 82 degrees Fahrenheit (28 Celsius), while the nights are mild
- Mormon Tabernacle Choir. One of the convention highlights will be a performance given by this world-renowned choir. For many, this alone will make their visit worthwhile
- Genealogy. The Family History Library in Salt Lake is renowned for the genealogical records gathered from all over the world. In the House of Friendship during the RI convention, a bank of computers will be available for those wishing to find out more about their lineage
- Social Life. There are plenty of bars, fine restaurants and excellent hotel accommodation in the city. The fact that Salt Lake hosted huge numbers of international visitors at the 2002 Winter Olympics means that the infrastructure is in place to look after people's needs
- Host City Activities. Among the activities already organized there is an evening of musical theatre and opera; a rendezvous in the park, involving four different themes; a Rocky Mountain rodeo; Mountain West entertainment and a Rendezvous Evening of Sensational Entertainment
- National Parks. The number of national parks found within a day's drive of Salt Lake City is astounding. From Yellowstone in the north to the Grand Canyon to the south, there are many wonderful places to visit before and/or after the Convention

We hope and expect that hundreds of Aussies will come out and support President Bill Boyd and Lorna at their RI Convention in Salt Lake City. Join us, and we'll arrange our own get together with them!!

Guest Speaker - Jim Daly

Our Chairman for the night introduced Jim Daly, who is currently completing his Ph.D.; the subject for his thesis is "Ethics in Sport".

Jim's talk highlighted the parallels between sport and business and the growing need to ensure ethical standards in both communities. Sport is a major part of the Australian National Identity and as part of our culture gives meaning to and opens windows on our society. Despite the size of its population Australia hits well above its weight in areas of sporting prowess. This has brought about a need for National bodies to control the sport and has resulted in the formation of Governing bodies or Boards within those bodies. These Boards have to have high ethical standards and practices in the same manner as the Board of any commercial or business organisation. Sport is big money with billions spent on it and its ability to promote products through its participants

We are all aware of the triple bottom line in business, where environment has been added as a third level, Jim was calling for a fourth level for both sport and business adding ethical behaviour. The Sabanes Oxley Act in the USA added a further level of compliance reporting for business organisations, shortly followed, in this country, by the Corporate Law Economic Reform Program (CLERP). Ethics are high on the agenda of most western nations and the need for parallels in sport continues to strengthen.

Jim concluded his talk by presenting a short paper on Business Ethics – Lessons Learned from Sport, which outlined best practices and the means for effective leadership and management that should be adopted in business.
