Club Assembly

As this meeting was a club assembly, President Stephen took the reins for the night and introduced members of the Board to give their reports on the activities of their committees. Due to the length of the reports I have only précised the content.

Club Service: Greg McLeod was first cab off the rank with a report on Club Service, the committee are working well and the club is functioning efficiently, significant progress has been made with updating policy and procedures.

Community Service: Jerry Casburn presented the Community Service Committee report with an update on the Carols at the Rotunda which will be a bigger event this year, much work had been completed on finding an Unley specific project with the committee deciding to pursue a suggestion of President Stephen's to provide a shed for retired men to tinker in. The committee had also decided to support an initiative on mental health in the Murray Bridge area, which will hopefully be led by local Rotary clubs.

International Service: John Peacham delivered the International Service Committee report with the main focus being on the joint project in Chiang Mi in Thailand. Good progress is being made with the likely outcome the delivery of Day Care facilities for a hill tribe. Additionally the committee continue to support Shelter box initiatives, the Donations in Kind and reserving funding for any short term crisis arising through the year.

Vocational Youth Service: Bob Laws presented the Vocational Youth Service Committee report. Another active committee, support for the Indigenous medical student continues and Natalie Moore will be a speaker at the Christmas dinner. The committee have also written to 75 doctors in the Unley area seeking funds for an additional scholarship, \$2,808 received to date from three donations. Support also continues for vocational talks and visits and the "Emerging Artists Programme" is an initiative of the committee. Planning for the Police Officer of the Year will commence in early 2007.

Membership: Kaylene Kranz gave the update on membership with the main initiative being the Information night, in conjunction with this 20,000 leaflets will be circulated with the Messenger newspaper advertising the event.

Fundraising & Fellowship: Greg Love updated the club on fund raising with a variety of initiatives designed to bolster club funds given falling Thrift Shop profits. These included Emerging Artists, the monthly raffles and future projects aimed at footie tipping, a film night and a quiz night, in the New Year.

The Rotary Foundation: Chandra Sluggett gave The Rotary Foundation Committee report in Mavis Martin's absence. Activity is focused on two events in November the multi-cultural night and a further event on November 28th recognising Rotary Foundation activity in relieving human suffering, the main focus being PolioPlus.

Thrift Shop: President Stephen concluded the reports with the Thrift Shop, highlighting the great progress in refitting but again reminding the club of the difficulties in getting volunteer support. This was the catalyst for a strong debate on where we are going with the Thrift shop and President Stephen promised that this would be a topic for Board discussion and further action.
