Announcements from President Stephen

- 1. Last Friday evening ten Rotarians and partners gathered with members of the Unley Lions Club in the Mayor's Parlour for drinks. Mayor Michael Keenan took the opportunity to thank the two service clubs for the contribution their members have made to the City of Unley over the last 12 months.
- 2. Next week we have the first Rotary Membership Information night for this Rotary year. Bob Mullins has kindly been sending me copies of details of people who have responded to the invitation distributed to the general public in our area through the Messenger Press. There appears to have been a good response from the public so far, and so I want to encourage all Rotarians to make a concerted effort to attend the Information Night at the Unley Civic Centre next Tuesday at 6 for 6.30pm and to make the prospective members feel welcome.
- 3. At last week's Club Assembly there was discussion about the problems the Thrift Shop Committee is facing with filling the midweek roster, with filling unanticipated volunteer absences, and with stagnant sales while costs continue to rise. Members present at the assembly made a number of thoughtful suggestions as to how these problems could be addressed and I undertook to take them to last week's Board meeting.

At its meeting last Tuesday night the board recognised that the scope of work needed to be done to revitalize the Thrift Shop is beyond the capabilities of the Thrift Shop Committee alone. Indeed the members of that committee are mostly already busy with other club and board responsibilities. The Board has decided that the main functions performed by the six members of the Thrift Shop Committee should be assigned to the club's standing committees. This means that the committees will need to reevaluate their project plans for this year so that they can reasonably undertake the Thrift Shop related tasks assigned to them. The Thrift Shop Committee would also be reconstituted as a policy and coordination body with appropriate representation for each of the main

Jerry Casburn and I were delegated to prepare a proposal for how the Thrift Shop's functions could be effectively reassigned to the committees and to present our proposal to the Board as soon as practicable. Jerry and I met to discuss the proposal today and will be in a position to distribute our proposals to the board within the week. It is to be hoped that the committees will be able to take-up their new responsibilities from the date of their December meetings.

- 4. President Stephen presented a certificate of appreciation to Bob Laws as Chairman of the Vocational and New Generations committee, from the Australian Rotary Health Research Foundation for the club's contributions to the Indigenous Health Scholarships Program in 2006.
- 5. President Stephen finished by offering the club's support for Ron as he prepares for his operation and the club's wishes for a speedy recovery and return to Rotary.

Board Positions

Board positions of two Directors and the Secretary and Treasurer will become vacant on 30th June 2007 and nominations for candidates for election to these positions will be received by Secretary Sheila Evans up to 8.00pm on Tuesday 21st November. An election to fill these positions will be held at the Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 5th December. Secretary Sheila Evans is eligible for re-election as is Treasurer David Payne. As Mavis Martin is completing the second year of Laurie Madigan's two-year term as a Director, she is eligible for election as a Director for a further two years in her own right. Bob Laws is in the second year of his two-year term as a Director and will retire from that position on 30th June 2007. This announcement will be printed in the bulletin from each week until nominations close.

Kaylene also reminded the club of availability of Christmas Cakes and Puddings.

Books to the Philippines Project

Geoff Howland introduced the session to the club and invited Rose Howland to speak first.

Rose went on to thank the club for its participation, and presented banners to President Stephen from two clubs in the Philippines and an appreciation certificate given to Geoff.

Rose was followed by Darcy Walsh, a member of the Rotary Club of East Davao, and who has been managing the project locally. Darcy briefed the club with a presentation on the programme, which had been initiated following the analysis of reading levels in developing countries which placed the Philippines 41st of 43 countries. The programme is supported by the Federal Government which sees it as a means of both providing benefit to a poorer cousin and combating terrorism through reducing levels of ignorance. The programme provides books and personal computers in reading centres via the activities of Donations in Kind. Unley club has been at the fore in supporting and funding the programme and Darcy reiterated earlier thanks for such support.
