2. We have received the December 2006 Newsletter from OSSAA, which I'll pass on to John Peacham for anyone who is interested in seeing some of the superb work that OSSAA has done recently in Indonesia and Timor Leste.
3. We have received the Australian Cranio-Maxillo Facial Foundation's December 2006 Newsletter, which I'll pass on to Jerry Casburn for anyone who is interested in having a look at it.

We have received a letter from Hon Mal Brough, Minister for Families, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs advising us that our application last year for a Volunteer Small Equipment Grant was completely unsuccessful. However, our application was highly regarded and met all the relevant criteria selection and will be automatically included in the next round of grant applications. It looks like you have to be in the process for a while before you float up to where the reviewers of applications actually see you.

I had accepted an invitation from the City of Unley to attend their Annual Citizenship Ceremony on the evening of Thursday 25th January, but unfortunately I will be in Sydney on that day and will be unable to attend and represent the club. Guest Speakers

Richard Lumb and Richard Stapleton were introduced by the chairman for the evening, Joan Reed. Both Richards are in the medical profession and have been working actively in Indonesia to improve control over Tuberculosis. In Australia annually there are some 3-5 cases of TB per year, per 100,000 heads of population. Indonesia is the third worst in the world, behind India and China with as many as 400 cases of TB per day. HIV exacerbates the problem escalating the incidence of TB as many as 10 fold. Both Richards have been working in Bali principally where HIV is a major issue and they are recording as many as 12 deaths per day from TB. Their DOTS strategy is fourfold; political commitment, adequate diagnosis, observed treatment and free drugs. In a report completed by them they found that there was incomplete training, low rates of supervisory visits, underutilisation of procedure manuals and inadequate actioning. This is coupled with substandard and poorly maintained equipment, particularly microscopes. Support is sought from wherever possible to upgrade equipment and its maintenance.

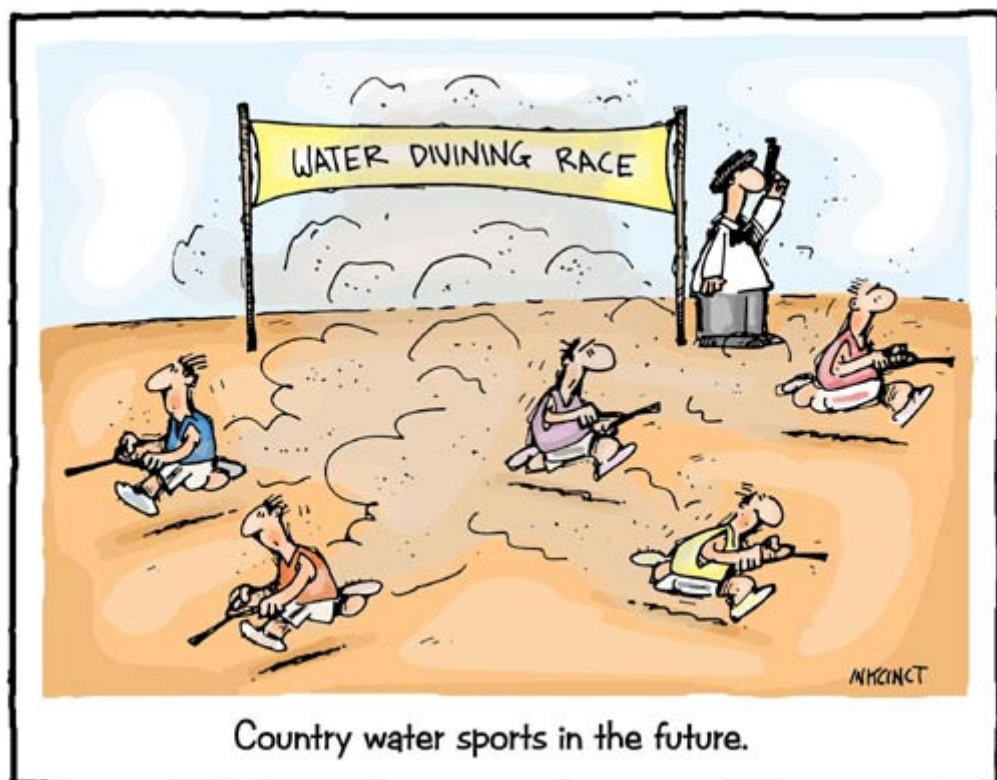
