1. The Rotary Club of Reynella has invited us to an inaugural dinner to raise funds for Life Education. The Life Education organisation's mission is to empower the young to make the best choices for a safe life, through its leading drug and health education programs. Life Education Australia is the nation's largest not-for-profit provider of preventative drug education in schools and their program is used extensively to complement schools' drug and health education programs at the pre-school, primary and secondary school levels. The dinner will be held on Friday 23rd March at the Belair Country Club at 6.30pm for 7.00pm. The guest speaker will be the CEO and Chairman of Life Education Australia, and the cost is \$25 per person for two courses (drinks extra).

The Reynella club has set an ambitious goal of raising \$28,000 for Life Education in 2007, and Greg Love has suggested that our Club make up a table or two to support this worthwhile fundraiser, so please speak to him if you and you partners might be interested in supporting the Reynella club's project.

Guest Speaker – Steven Trigg



Greg McLeod introduced **Steven Trigg**, CEO of the Adelaide football club as our speaker for the night. Steven's achievements are impressive, before leading "the Crows" he both played football for, and captained, Central Districts as well as playing with North Adelaide. He coached at the Sturt Football Club. Steven joined the Adelaide Football Club in 1997 at the height of their powers and has been CEO since December 2001. He has been a school teacher and a media personality in both print and television. Steven holds an MBA and is a graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors.

Having gauged the interests of his audience Steven enthralled the club with his views on the football scene and finances, its players and how much they are paid. The Crows have been very successful in increasing support with more than 45,000 spectators weekly and 50,000+ in the supporters club. Of these some 98% renew annually, a significant achievement given that some clubs struggle to retain 70%. 25% of the club's budget goes on salaries with players averaging \$200,000 and two last year earning between \$700,000 \$800,000. So how is football different from any other major company? Constant public scrutiny whether it is how the team played, management decisions or player behaviour. Also the very high levels of emotion, just see the mail if the club lose to Port Adelaide.

Steven went on to point out that the structure in football is socialist, not capitalist, with salary caps, the losing teams getting first choice in the draft. Making it hard to consistently win the cup. Steven felt that the key planks for success were people, innovation and teamwork.

A Very Special Occasion – Farewell to Jo Blowes

Tonight was a very special occasion marking the retirement from the Thrift Shop, as co-ordinator, of Jo Blowes. After 28 years, Jo and husband Alvin are taking some time for themselves and travelling.

President Stephen presented Jo with a gift, flowers and certificate to mark this event. Jo was joined by her able Thrift Shop volunteers: Marnie Phillips, Pamela Goodgame and Muriel Wallace, who were also presented with flowers.



Jo has been a stalwart of the Thrift shop for 28 years. She started, as President Stephen said, because someone asked her. She got very involved and as previously mentioned by Bob Laws, more than a million dollars has been earned during her tenure. The money was used in all of the Avenues of Service the club supports.

The club bestowed a Paul Harris Fellowship on Jo some years ago and now was a time to say deep thanks to Jo and her family and wish her well in her travels. Jo in her response said she had a great time but it was time for family things. She thanked the club and in particular the helpers attending this evening and Joan Job who was unable to attend.
