Announcements from President Stephen

1. Sadly I must inform you that Joan Reid, the widow of our late esteemed member Gordon Reid passed away peacefully last Thursday after a long illness. The funeral was held yesterday and was attended by several members of our club's Ladies Auxiliary who worked side-by-side with Joan in the Thrift Shop and on the Auxiliary for many years. This week I will be sending sympathy cards on behalf of the club to Joan's daughters Trish Strachan and Libby Knox. I would like to thank Ken and Pauline Daly for bringing Joan's passing to the club's attention.



2. Meeting Program Changes:

- The club website's Meeting Program page now shows the meetings when the Committees, Club Service Committee and the Board will be meeting for the remainder of this Rotary year, including the Change Over Dinner on 3 July.
- On 6 March there will be a supplementary AGM to complete the election of Board members for the next Rotary year.
- There will be a Club Assembly on Tuesday 13 March and the Club Assembly scheduled for 24 April has been put back to 8 May to give a greater span of time after the Assembly in March.
- The Unley-Mitcham Bowls Challenge will be held on Tuesday 20 March (because the Mitcham club couldn't make the originally scheduled date of 13 March due to long standing service project commitments). At this stage the event is likely to be held at the Unley Bowling Club with the UBC doing the catering. The Fellowship Committee is finalising these arrangements.
- After the joint meeting with the Rotary Club of Prospect on 27 March there will be a brief Joint Board meeting of the 2006-7 and 2007-8 Board members to complete the administrative requirements that could not be attended to in December, as required by the bylaws, due to the election of Board members not being completed. The regular monthly board meeting will continue after the joint meeting has finished its work.
- 3. Ken Daly phoned me yesterday to advise that the Hyde Park Probus Club will be folding within the month, largely due to their inability to get members to be office bearers. It is likely that many of the club's 40 or so members will transfer to the Unley Probus Club. Some of you may recall that when the Hyde Park Probus Club was formed the Rotary Club of Unley presented them with a bell and gavel. The Probus club has proposed that the bell and gavel be either be given to another association or returned to this club, and the Board will discuss this proposal tonight. Perhaps the Community Service Committee might like to approach the Hyde Park Probus members to see if any might be interested in volunteering at the Thrift Shop.
- 4. The March issue of *Rotary Down Under* gives an insight into what is ahead under the leadership of incoming Rotary International President Wilfrid Wilkinson from Canada. The main report is a comprehensive question and answer interview. He talks about his theme of *Rotary Shares* (not to be confused with Share Rotary), pointing out that almost everything Rotary does involves sharing. *Rotary Shares* is a call to action with District governors sharing their leadership skills and dedication to make clubs and Districts stronger. Wilfrid Wilkinson has 45 years of service and sharing in Rotary. He has been to Australia and New Zealand recently to take part in Rotary Institutes and these are covered in details in another article.

Water is on the minds of many people in the western world if not on the lips of all in emerging countries. Rotary Down Under begins a series on water projects under the heading of Better Water, a Better Life. World Water Day is on March 22. Clubs in Australia and New Zealand are showing the way in assisting people in India toward a more reliable supply of potable water.

Guest Speaker

Bob Laws our Chairman for the night introduced **Dr. Mark Moore**. Mark Moore was born in Timaru NZ, went to University in Dunedin and underwent Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery training in Christchurch. He came to Adelaide 20 years ago and works in Adelaide and the Children's Hospital. He also has a private practice out of Calvary, North Adelaide. Mark was one of the prime movers behind



OSSAA (he approached our Club to provide the administrative support to form the charity). He has undertaken over 25 volunteer trips to East Timor and Flores, Indonesia and has brought relief to pain and suffering to many hundreds of disadvantaged people.

Mark is one of the surgeons supporting the Ossa teams, funding for which comes from service clubs, including Unley. The teams consist of surgeons and nurses and all of the equipment needed for operations performed in East Timor and Flores. Mark has made more than 20 trips with the last being the least enjoyable following changes in the attitudes of the local people where the desire to do things for themselves has dropped. The teams perform a variety of operations with serious burns, hair lip operations and facial deformities such as goitres. In a graphic presentation Mark showed many before and after photographs, with amazing changes to the patients treated. Children and adults treated have their lives dramatically altered as they are no longer prevented from schooling and a normal life, previously the deformities would have prevented their acceptance into society. Some treatments are not viable locally and in rare instances the patient will be flown to Adelaide where surgery is performed free of charge. The teams perform, in two weeks, the same number of operations that Mark would see in two years in Australia. Many things contribute to causing the problems from malnutrition to a lack of folate, poor environments, and the high risk of severe burns from kerosene burners and poor quality, non fire resistant clothing.

Mark performs a very special role and we were very grateful for such an informative talk.

Having Dr. Mark Moore at the meeting, presented an opportunity for the club to give its annual presentation of a cheque for \$5000. The club committed to do this over a three year period and this is the final year. President Stephen presented the cheque to Mark. The monies will likely go to purchasing a diathermy machine (I hope this is how it's spelt but none of you lot will know any better) for use overseas.


