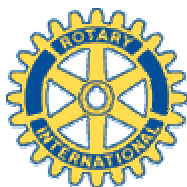

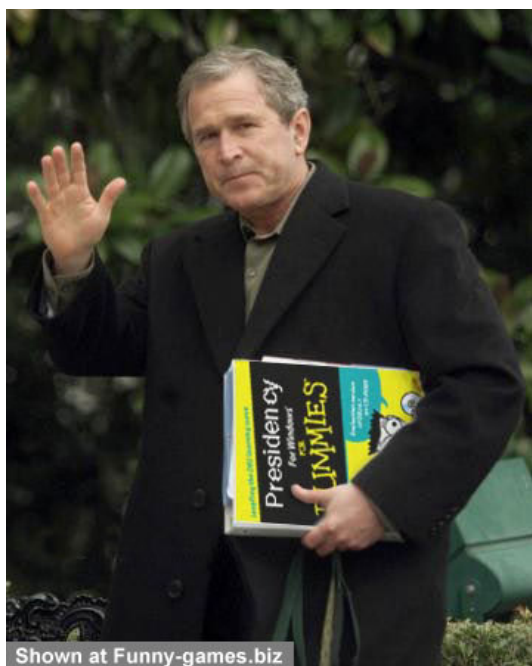

Announcements from President Stephen

Guest Speaker



President Stephen, our Chairman for the night, introduced **Matthew Elliott**. Matthew is a first class cricketer playing for South Australia. The former Australian opener, Matthew will soon join Yorkshire for the 2007 season. Matthew is halfway through his final coaching qualifications in Australia and sees this as the ideal progression from playing. With over 16,000 first class runs to his name, including 50 centuries, Matthew is one of Australia's most experienced player/coaches.

Matthew explained the joys and agonies of test cricket by suggesting it is about making the most of the opportunity. Win or lose he was there to enjoy the experience. Brought up in Lancaster, Matthew's father was a keen cricketer and they spent hours training in their own cricket net. He started his career playing for Collingwood, cricket not AFL, and we'll forgive his poor judgement in supporting the AFL team also. He went on to play for Victoria with his first game against South

Australia. He recalled trips away with both the State & Australian teams, recounting the experiences in new cities and the excitement he got.

He played for Australia, playing at Lords and said it was one of his most memorable experiences. He also talked of his international experiences in playing in the West Indies, he expected the high life and was shocked to see the difference in culture forced to stay in the hotel as the streets weren't safe to venture on.

In a final question session he replied that the best coach he had worked with was David Hook and also that the sledging that went on at matches was an art form.

Carols at the Rotunda

Following agreement at the last Board meeting the 2007 Carols at the Rotunda have been booked for Sunday 16th December 2007. We have also elected to try a new group of children's entertainers, Ticklish Allsorts instead of the Funkees. All of the key performers have also been booked.

In relation to concluding the 2006 carols, final accounts have been presented and we made a modest profit of \$483. Schools are being written to, thanking them for participation in the Colouring competition and advising them of the profitable outcome which will be returned to the community through Rotary.

The working bee was successful and the centre will open in April, Unley Rotary will be invited to attend the opening.

Work is progressing on the patio, which will be funded by the club. The intent is to have a Rotary Wheel mosaic in the centre made from tiles. The club, along with Mobilong will promote the activity through a display at the district conference and is seeking to sell one paver to each club in 9520 for \$200. Proceeds will pay for shade covering and outdoor furniture.

The Men's Shed

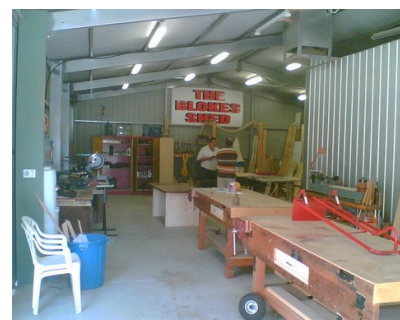
After much discussion within the committee it was agreed that we would promote use of the Edwardstown shed but only following a survey with local homes and groups dealing with the local seniors to see what use will be made of the facility.

The committee hopes to host a meeting at the shed, with BBQ, to encourage members to support club participation.

Thrift Shop

After discussion it was agreed that there were a number of initial objectives:

- Specification of job content of key thrift shop roles.
- Recruitment from local clubs, existing volunteers and press advertising.
- Change of focus from Rotary Thrift shop to "Community Thrift Shop" supported by Rotary.
- Move to a more up market position.



Sheila was nominated as our representative and \$1,000 has been granted by the Board for recruiting advertising.

A job specification and charter were reviewed at the community service meeting and agreed with minor modifications. This is now being circulated for wider club and volunteer's comment.

An advert was placed in the Eastern Courier this week and to date Sheila has had three contacts. A session at the shop was organised last Saturday to allow the potential volunteers to see the premises and to be interviewed.
