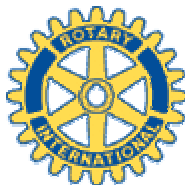

Announcements from President Stephen

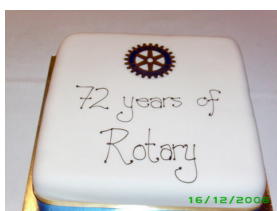

She claimed this sacking was the best thing that happened to her as her life has improved 400% since she stopped doing breakfast radio.

She is now the mother of two children, the featured columnist for the Sunday Mail, a talk-back host on FIVEAA, has raised more than \$1 million for charity and last year came second in class 73 spreads, two varieties, at the Adelaide Show with her lemon butter.

Amanda regaled us with her life story. Leaving school as soon as she could, she went on to a variety of jobs, more nearly thirty in a few years. She found her niche in radio broadcasting. Amanda earned a reputation as a straight talker who would not compromise her values. This led to many fights with station management but Amanda held her position.

Now happily married to a Doctor her priority is her family and she makes sure she balances home commitments with commercial life.

Disclosing that she was born to be a radio host she certainly demonstrated an ability to be able to ad lib and was one of the most entertaining speakers the club has seen.

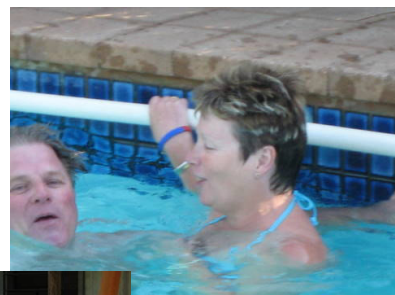

Club Updates – Fundraising and Fellowship – Greg Love

The Rotary Club of Unley seeks funds for three major areas - Membership Funds, Rotary International Foundation and Club Project Funds.

Membership Funds: Are accumulated from admission fees to member's functions, membership dues and meal charges paid by members and guests, fines and birthday donations paid by members, and the profit from the weekly wine raffle and the like. These funds are used to cover the costs of Club administration, meals for members and guests, and equipment required for Club activities and any other cost approved by the Board of Directors.

Rotary International Foundation invests and redistributes funds raised by the Club or by direct donations for members to be paid into Rotary International Foundation for RI worldwide projects.

Club Project Funds are accumulated from the net proceeds of all special fund raising activities of the Club or any Committee of the Club, interest earned on Club funds and donations to the Club.

The largest proportion of these funds is the net proceeds from the Thrift Shop. The balance of the funds comes from special fundraising activities.

In principle the total of the Club Project Funds raised in any given Rotary year are spent in the following year. Hence all Club Project Funds accumulated in 2006 -2007 will be expended in 2007 -2008. The incoming Board will allocate budgets for the major committees; Community Service, International Service and Vocational Service and Youth.

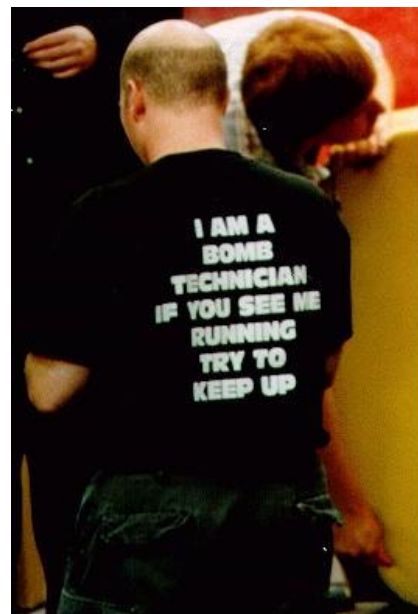
While there is still about 10 weeks to run to the end of this Rotary year the net Thrift Shop total looks to be about \$22,000 to \$25,000. The balance of the funds coming from special fund raising activities will be about \$5,000.

A great concern for the Club is that the Thrift Shop net total is being reduced from two directions; gross sales are down since we moved location and overheads (rent, insurance, power etc) has increased.

Special fund raising activities has included the Emerging Artists Program, weekly raffles including the Easter Egg Basket Raffle, Christmas cakes and puddings and Entertainment books sale:

During 2006-2007 fellowship was a part of fundraising hence the line between the two seemed to be a little blurred at times.

Fellowship has included in recent weeks the Bowling Challenge night and the Fellowship picnic. The committee is hopeful of finishing the year with a movie night.
