Guest Speaker



The evening meeting was staged by the Community Service Committee at the "Blokeshed" at Edwardstown Baptist Church. This year the community service committee has been searching for a project with local relevance. A variety of programmes were investigated with one of these being the provision of a men's shed for use by male senior citizens. President Stephen suggested the idea. Further investigation led to strong support for such a facility from both local homes and through the Council's senior citizen's advisory committee. The Edwardstown facility was suggested as a model for such a venture. Again, following investigation it was further thought that given the nature of the facility and its relative close proximity to Unley we might share rather than invent our own. The evening was an opportunity for the club to see the place and allow a decision at a later stage, by club members, as to a desire to support the programme.

We were welcomed to the facility by Sandy George the Director for the programmes and we were given an explanation of the workings of the men's shed by Neil Berry who supervises the project.

The men's shed is currently used on only four occasions per week and caters for up to six people using the facility. This could be increased to eight people over more sessions if



the area is increased by removing part of the shed used for storage plus, if further tools were acquired and if supervisors were found to manage the sessions.

The shed was initially the idea of the pastor of the church and was ultimately supported by Sandy George. Funding came from the church as well as grants from Mitcham Council and the Premier's office.

A further \$4,000 is needed to manage the expansion and your Community Service Committee were looking to provide \$2000 towards the expansion, a grant of monies over coming years, made annually, as well as actively support the shed through publicity and helping to find suitably qualified supervisors. None of this would be committed to until further discussion and a vote on the matter had been undertaken. Expect further advice on the matter over coming weeks.

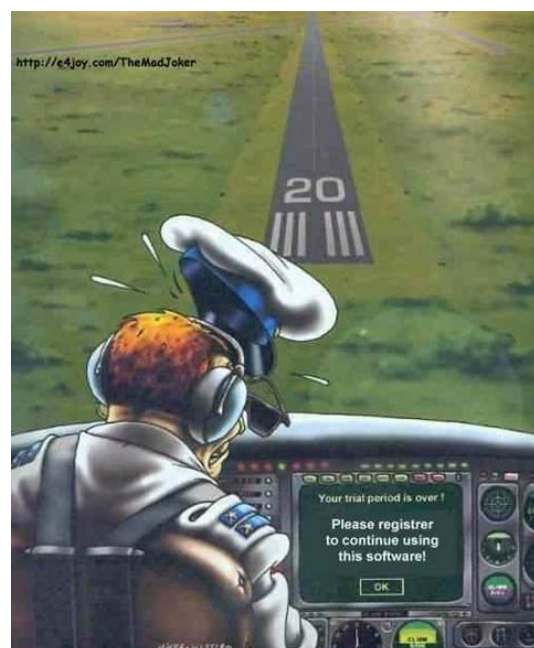
