Sergeant's Session

There was no sergeant's session or draw this week.



Guest Speaker - Simon Temke



Our meeting this week was a visit to the Meteorological Office in Kent Town, organised by the Vocational Committee. Our chairman for the evening was **Jim Newall** who introduced our host for the evening **Simon Temke**. Simon is a meteorologist and has worked in the Adelaide office for the last five years with the five preceding years in Melbourne. This must have been a challenge with the weather in Melbourne changing every fifteen minutes.

Our visit was broken into two parts; first a presentation on the workings of the office and second a tour of the premises to see the centre in action. Simon explained that the Meteorological Office became a national organisation in 1908, after federation, as part of the Meteorological act. Their charter was to set up and collect observations and to produce



forecasts. The South Australia regional centre houses 92 staff with 23 meteorologists. Their functions cover a severe weather section, hydrology, climate & consultancy, National tidal centre (designed as part of the early warning system put in

place after the Tsunami), observations, engineering and computing. The national budget is \$230 million, roughly \$10 per annum, per person.



Simon went on to explain weather systems and how the data is used to forecast the weather. **President Stephen** answered all of Simon's questions with unswerving accuracy, confirming a long held belief that he is smarter than he looks.

Their website is the most popular of the government websites and is about third or fourth nationally for all web hits. Charts are still produced manually with satellite images used extensively. Radar also plays an important part and the centre uses global



models on which it bases it predictions for up to 10 days ahead. Contrary to popular belief they maintain a high degree of accuracy. Their measure is +/- 5 degrees, outside of this it is classified as a major error and the

number of these has dropped from more than 20 per year to five in 2005.

At the end of the visit, Jim thanked Simon for his presentation and the tour. Some of the group then adjourned to the Tap Inn, a local hostelry, for something to eat and drink.

The assembly was held for Peter Ochota, District Governor for the 2007/08 year. Various sessions were held to provide incoming Board members education on how to handle their role. Details were also given on the District Conference to be held in October of this year; more on that later.
