## Visit to State Parliament – Host: David Pisoni MP (Member for Unley)

Our host for the evening, **David Pisoni**, was introduced by **President Stephen.** Our dinner was held in the State Parliament and David gave the club an insight into his background and responsibilities in the Shadow Cabinet. David holds a wide portfolio as Shadow Minister for Business, the Portfolio for Volunteers, Consumer Affairs, Youth and Multicultural Affairs. Recent issues which have crossed David's desk have concerned rights for those living in caravan parks and honesty in Real Estate advertising (an oxymoron do I hear said?).

Following our meal we were given a tour of Parliament with David as our tour guide. David has an impressive knowledge of the history of government in South Australia, its Premiers and of the history of the building itself.











The building was erected in two stages, surprisingly 50 years apart, with the Lower House built first and the Upper house as an art deco addition. The lower house was opened in 1889. The stone used and the main structure was painstakingly matched to ensure that the end result was a single structure. David regaled us with stories of the past Premiers and of his own affections for people like Playford who by developing the Housing Trust, kept down the cost of labour, attracting manufacturing businesses away from the Eastern States and into South Australia. It seems the POMS, namely Martin Cooper and myself, have ancestors responsible for his downfall when he wouldn't allow the pubs to stay open and serve meals after 6pm.



Feeling a sense of power, members of the club were able to sit on the benches in the House of Assembly. David described the scene for those early days of Parliament (in the British House of Commons) where members would wear swords into the chamber and the bloodline on each side was designed to keep opposing factions apart. The mace wielded by the Speaker was used to quell riotous souls. Moving to the Legislative Council, the Upper House, we were confined to the gallery. Here, the President was only able to wield a Black Rod as those elected here were considered gentlemen and not prone to fighting. The lower house has 47 members elected every four years, the upper house 22 members, each elected for eight years and with 50% seeking election every four years.

The tour was interesting and our host very welcoming. President Stephen thanked David for his time and energy serving the community. The evening concluded with David facing his own Question Time from the club members.
