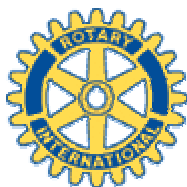

Announcements from President Stephen

President Stephen advised the club of an exchange of emails between DG Bob Northcote and himself. Bob was not able to join the meeting tonight but sent his congratulations to the Unley club for their contribution to the Rotary Foundation. In a first email from President Stephen, he outlined the 2006/07 contribution from our club and the key section of the email is copied below:

"At the beginning of last week the Australian Rotary Foundation Trust received a contribution of A\$3,600 from the Rotary Club of Unley. In addition to this we have contributed approximately A\$5,000 to a matching grant project in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Chaing Mai in Thailand to equip a new children's day care centre plus an unmatched donation of \$4,000 to build the centre, and this month we expect to contribute a further A\$1,000 to the Group 6 matching grant project in Mexico. I trust that these contributions meet with your approval."

DG Bob sent the following email from Utah where he is attending the conference, his reason for not being able to join us:

"Thank you very much for the great news about your support for The Foundation, both in giving and through the various MGs (Matching Grants) you are involved in. I knew you were very positive about the Foundation and confident you and your club would support it.

We are in S Utah and off to Bryce Canyon today having spent 12 hours at Zion Canyon y'day, where we were hiking in 36C heat."

President Stephen introduced the key event for the evening by thanking the Rotary Foundation Committee for its tireless efforts in raising funds for this key Rotary charity. The committee, under **Mavis Martin's** leadership, has currently raised sufficient to award two Paul Harris Fellowships and a third is on the way. The committee has also raised awareness of the Rotary Foundation through a series of education and training sessions and promoted a variety of associated activities. Now to the awards, President Stephen broke with tradition and advised who was getting the award prior to reading the citation. The citations follow.



Ron Schubert

“**Ronald Brian Schubert**, you were selected to receive this recognition because the Rotary Club of Unley believes that your life exemplifies the humanitarian and educational objectives of The Rotary Foundation. We thank you for demonstrating in your life and vocation a commitment to helping persons in need here and around the world.

Ron Schubert first joined the Rotary Club of Mount Barker in 1978.

He was subsequently inducted into the Rotary Club of Unley on 22nd June 1993.

He served as Chairman of:

- The International Committee in 1994-95;
- The Vocational Committee 1995-96; and again of
- The International Committee in 1996-97.

He also served on the District Rotary Foundation Committee in the years 1995-96 and 1996-97.

In June 1997 he took a break from Rotary until he was re-inducted into the Unley Club in December 2000.

In keeping with his desire to serve, he then took on the roles of:

- Club Secretary in 2002-03,
- President-Elect in 2003-04, and
- President and led the Club through its year of Celebrating Rotary in 2004-05, which was also the Club's 70th year.

Throughout more than 21 years of Rotary service this distinguished Rotarian has held the classification of Real Estate Commercial.”



Val Wasley

“We move closer to a more peaceful world today as **Valmai Anne Wasley** becomes a Paul Harris Fellow. Val, your contribution to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International is allaying suffering, improving living conditions, and providing educational opportunities for young people somewhere in the world. This is a truly selfless action.

Val, your generous donation of more than \$16,000 towards the alleviation of poverty and to the various programs of The Rotary Foundation exemplifies the spirit of true philanthropy.

Your decision to donate through Rotary to ensure that the money would be applied effectively, reliably and honestly, while also enabling your donation to be enhanced by a further 50% by Rotary Foundation matching grants, is most gratifying.

You have expressed a desire for the substantial part of your donation to be applied to the alleviation of poverty in India, and through the efforts of your sister Chandra, a project has now been identified to support the education of underprivileged women in India. It is our hope that this project can now be progressed quickly during the early part of the coming Rotary year and that your contribution and that of the Rotary foundation can also be supplemented by a matching grant from the District 9520 Designated Fund.

We thank you for your generosity and for your confidence in Rotary International and in the Rotary Club of Unley in particular.”



In acceptance speeches **Ron** told the club he was both dumbfounded and also very honoured to receive this prestigious award. He held Rotary very dear and particular the Rotary Club of Unley. Val described part of her life which involved various trips to India where **Val** and her husband, **Dennys**, had adopted three children taking them from a life of poverty. Her decision to donate money to Rotary was inspired by her sister **Chandra** and she was concerned that all monies should go to the cause and none absorbed in administration costs. What many attending did not know was that the money had been raised by Val using both Long Service and Annual Leave to work picking oranges with all earnings forming this magnificent donation.

“The Rotary Foundation and its Focus” - Peter Rostron



Introduced by **Past President Ron Schubert**, our speaker for the evening was **PDG Peter Rostron**. Peter joined the Rotary Club of Tea Tree Gully at its charter in 1985. He served as President in 1985/86, was Assistant Governor to D9500 in from 1999 to 2001 and then as DGE in 2001/02, followed by being District Governor of D9500 in 2002/03. Peter has also served as Chair of the Foundation in 2004/05 through to 2006/07. Peter is married to Kay and has three daughters and six grandchildren.

Peter's address focused on the role and structure of the foundation. He started by outlining the mission statement of the Foundation, which is:

“To support the efforts of Rotary International in the fulfillment of the Objective of Rotary, Rotary's mission, and the achievement of world understanding and peace through local, national, and international humanitarian educational and cultural programs.”

The foundation supports Educational and Cultural Programs such as Ambassadorial Scholarships; Group Study Exchange (GSE); Rotary Centres for International Study in Peace and Conflict Resolution; Rotary Grants for University Teachers; Rotary Peace and Conflict Studies; and it support Humanitarian Programs through Matching Grants; District Simplified Grants; Health, Hunger and Humanity Grants (3H); Volunteer Service Grants.

Fifty Percent of the Monies donated to TRF come back to the District three years after the donation is made and this money funds matching grants, volunteer service grants, 3-H grants, GSE and Rotary World Peace Fellows. The remaining fifty percent goes to the world fund which maintains the base investment and uses the interest to fund its programs.

Money is donated to TRF through outright gifts, the centurion programme and through final estate plans as benefactors and bequests.
