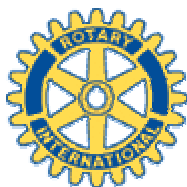

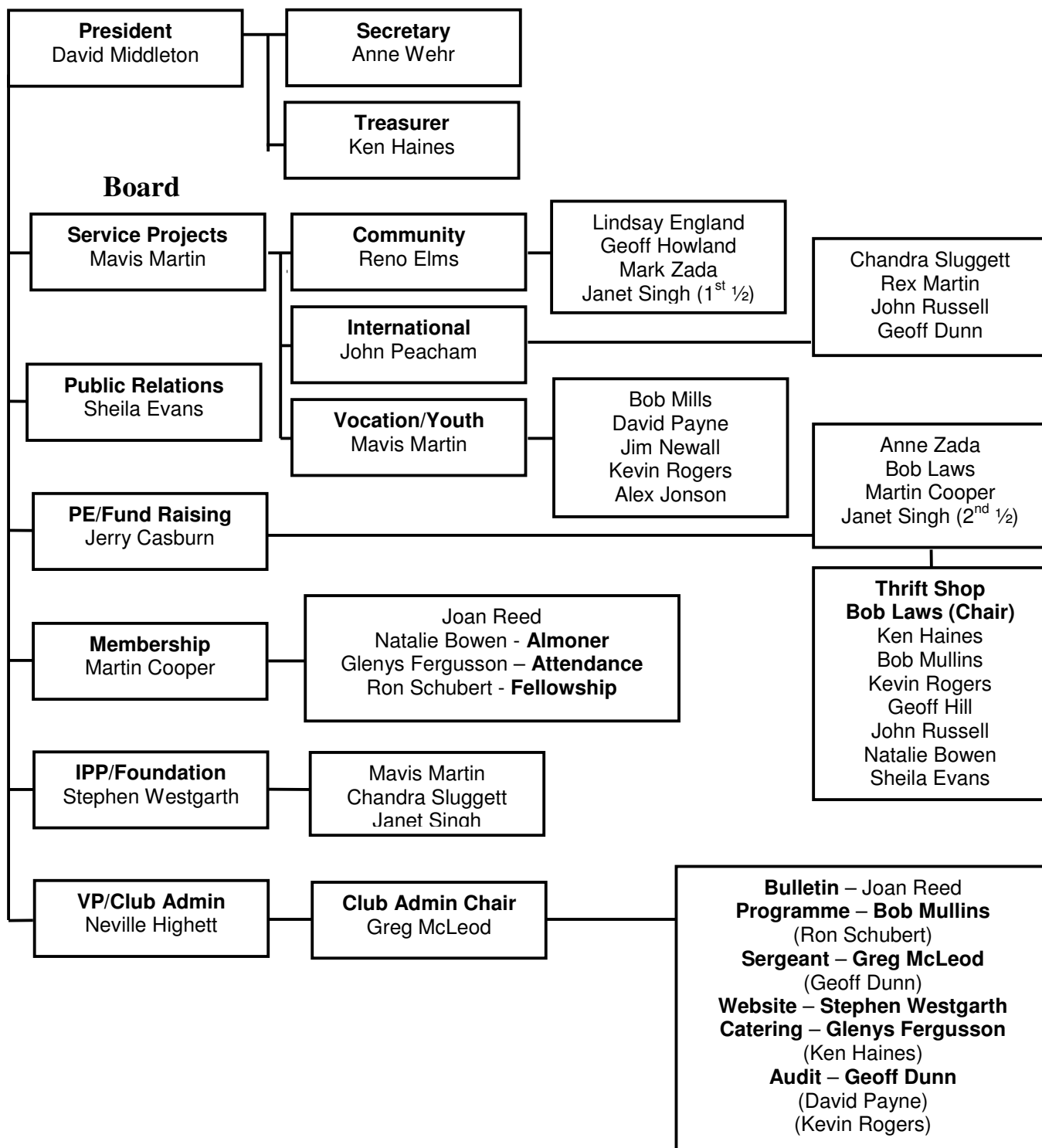

Our Sergeant for the evening **John Russell** took no prisoners and promptly relieved members of a few dollars to swell the coffers. Winner of the **lucky squares** was **Alex Johnston** and the **wine** was **David Middleton**

"Food Genetic Engineering" – Dr. Rohan Singh



Our chairman for the evening **President Stephen** introduced **Rohan** to the club. Rohan needed little introduction, as the wife of Janet he is already a regular attendee at meetings and other functions. The middle of four brothers, Rohan was born in Adelaide and attended St. Ignatius College. He completed his education at Adelaide University where he gained a B.Sc and a Ph.D.

Rohan's work is involved in genetic engineering with crops. The research is designed to create strains of crop appropriate to the environment in which they are grown. For example, in Australia, crops with high yield but which are drought resistant are highly desired.

In the past, crops would be cross pollinated and grown to determine if the end product would meet the requirement, a process which could take up to 14 years to find the right relationship.

DNA, the building block of life, can be analysed to determine the components that result in certain characteristics. Predicting the outcome shortens the process but still has to be field tested by developing the product and growing it, however, development time is halved to some 7 years. Unlike any human tests, the strains which do not contain the necessary DNA characteristics can be eliminated.

The process involves isolating the gene and then manipulating the DNA to obtain the desired result.

While there are many fears with GM modified foods Rohan explained that we can develop crops which result in major savings to the farming industry. As an instance, frost resistant strains are now grown in Victoria and South Australia saving \$130 million in lost crops. GM cotton has resulted in a reduced need for pesticides.

Four staple crops, soybean, maize, cotton and canola are now in widespread use in 22 countries by 10.3 million farmers. Australia is 11th in the world table for the production of GM crops.

Rohan was ably assisted by wife Janet. Now is she really looking intently at the presentation or just having a few Middleton ZZZZZs??

Rohan was thanked by President Stephen for the talk as well as his flexibility in allowing the session to be rescheduled on a number of occasions.
