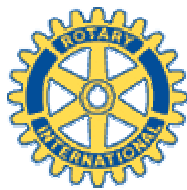

1. This year the District 9520 Conference has been bought forward to October 12th to 14th at Westminster School. Sergeants Session

Greg McLeod "**WOE BETIDE**"ably conducted the session and Geoff Hill won the square and Greg himself won the wine. Jokes and fines flowed in abundance. A good laugh was had by all and pockets were a little lighter at the end.

Our Guest Speaker – Cynthia Edwards

Jerry Casburn introduced our guest speaker who spoke on Bowel Cancer Prevention rather than a cure. Cynthia has worked at the Cancer foundation for 3 years and prior to that she worked in Physiotherapy for 16 years in Whyalla, Mt Gambier and Adelaide. She is married and has 5 children.

Cynthia spoke about the Cancer Council and explained that it is a non-government organization that has been in existence since 1928. Its vision is that South Australians reduce their cancer risk and receive the best cancer care.

Bowel Cancer is a slow growing cancer and therefore early detection is important. Home screening saves lives and there has been a program developed where all people over the age of 50 will eventually have a kit sent to their home for home screening. This test was explained to members present and all were encouraged to participate.

There are certain risk factors people can identify to help decrease the risk of cancer and they are stop smoking, not be overweight, reduce alcohol intake and eat a nutritious diet that has all the food groups in it.

Symptoms to be aware of are bleeding from the rectum or in the faeces, change in bowel habits, being Tired and anaemic (pale), abdominal pain and unexplained weight loss.

Once again, a great speaker on a very important subject.
