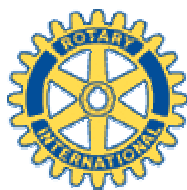

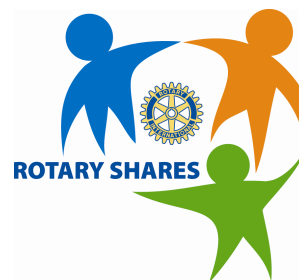

Our Guest Speaker

Jerry Casburn introduced Cathy Murphy who is the State Manager of Starlight Children's Foundation – a role she has held for the past twelve months. She is responsible for establishing the SA office and ensuring that ill children in this state will benefit from all of Starlight's programs. Cathy has spent the last 11 years in the Charity sector. It was while studying for her marketing degree that she realised that she wanted to make her career within organisations that exist to make a difference to lives and to work in roles which she could feel passionate about. Her most important role and passion is being a mum to her 2 daughters.

Cathy presented a presentation summarizing what Starlight is all about:

Through the commitment and passion of prominent Australian business people, sporting personalities and healthcare professionals, in 1988 the totally independent, Starlight Children's Foundation of Australia was born. Starlight originated in Los Angeles in 1983, so we are an international charity - with offices throughout the US, Canada and the UK - as well as Australia.

Our mission is to brighten the lives of all seriously ill and hospitalised children and their families, throughout Australia. Our hospital programs include Starlight Express Rooms, Starlight Fun Centres and Starlight Express Vans - geared to deliver fun and entertainment to hospitalised children around the country.

Out of hospital, Starlight's Wish Granting program grants the wish of children aged four to eighteen who suffer from any serious illness, and meet our criteria. While Starlight Escapes provides the children and their families with fun group outings and activities, throughout the year.

Our Guiding Principles form the basis for all Starlight relationships between the children and their families and our supporters and volunteers. Starlight is funded entirely from within Australia and the funds are spent in Australia for the benefit of seriously ill and hospitalised children and their families. Starlight does not receive any government funding and is entirely supported by individuals and corporations through special events, cause-related marketing promotions and in kind support of both goods and services.

Living with illness or injury can cause enormous strain in the lives of children and their families. The everyday joys of childhood often take a backseat to the stress of treatment and isolation.

Since 1988 Starlight has delivered innovative 'Distractive Therapy Programs' within hospital environments, with the endorsement and support of the healthcare profession. Our programs are designed to be an integral part of the total health care of children.

Our club looks forward to our involvement with this great organization
