#### Conference Announcements

- Registrations will commence at 2.00 pm on Friday 12th October, and attendees are encouraged to arrive and register early, inspect the exhibits in the House of Friendship, sample the wines which will be available for tasting and ordering, and have a cup of tea or coffee. If everyone arrives a few minutes before 5.00 pm it will cause difficulties.
- The Friday afternoon session starts at 5.00 pm and everyone is asked to be seated by 4.50 pm (and enjoy the music) because the Governor of South Australia will be arriving shortly after 5.00 pm. Strict protocol demands that everyone is seated before the Governor enters the auditorium. People arriving after 5pm will not be admitted until after the formal opening. The Governor has indicated he will be attending the Welcome Function after the opening session, and this will provide a great opportunity to meet him.

# Our Guest Speaker: Visit to the Army Museum at Keswick Barracks

Members enjoyed a very informative tour of the Keswick Army Barracks museum.

There was extensive memorabilia from all the wars. It was established in 1992 and represents all of the services in South Australia although some Regimental Associations maintain their own collections. Foremost among the Museum's acquisitions is the "Robert Gray Collection" consisting of nearly 10,000 items of Army badges, buttons and military insignias. Also on display are copies of watercolour paintings by local artist Des Bettany painted during his internment as a POW in Changi during WW11. The museum is open on Sundays from 12pm until 4pm and admission is a donation. Guided tours can be arranged by appointment.
