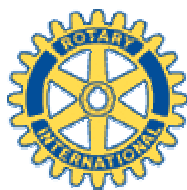

Martin Cooper on behalf of the Membership Committee:

1. Handed out the fliers recently printed to be distributed throughout the Unley area inviting new membership. He has called for a working bee on the 28th of October 2007 to distribute those fliers with members and partners walking nominated streets and placing in letterboxes – more details later.
2. Each member of the club has been asked to nominate a suitable potential member on the form handed out. The Membership Committee will then contact that recommended nominee with the view to inviting them to become a Rotarian.

John Russell: The joint District Donations in Kind storeroom at Salisbury has approx \$5 million items in storage. Approx \$220,000 worth of goods has been sent overseas last year. All clubs in both Districts have been scheduled to a busy bee to load containers and Unley has been allocated the 12th of November from 10 am till 3pm. The Philippines community will provide lunch. All members are asked to get behind this project It is very important.

Our Guest Speaker: Graeme Bethune, CEO of Energy Quest

Chairperson Stephen Westgarth introduced Graeme Bethune the CEO of Energy Quest to speak on the subject "Is South Australia Energy Rich or Poor." Graeme is a member of the Adelaide Rotary Club (our mother club) and is married with 3 children.

Energy is becoming a very important National issue with WA and Qld the main energy production states. Woodside in north-west shelf of WA is the largest producer in Australia and has large contracts signed with China. Australia is 60% self sufficient in energy. Qld has strong black coal deposits but is rapidly growing in gas reserves. The premier Cooper Basin in South Australia has declining reserves and is increasingly becoming more reliant on QLD. NSW has little oil or gas but does have black coal. Victoria produces and mines large brown coal deposits with some gas discoveries. South Australia has falling gas and oil production, and uranium deposits doubt will become our source of energy. Oil and gas exploration is continuing in South Australia outside of the Cooper Basin. Australia desperately needs a major oil strike.

Graeme stated that South Australia has the cleanest energy producing method among the states via the wind farms. It is also well placed to produce power Geo Thermally. South Australia has the best hot rock resources the country. We are the Cinderella state, is about to become a major exporter of energy through huge uranium deposits.
