Our Guest Speaker: Colin James

Chairperson Ron Schubert introduced Colin James who is the Legal Affairs Editor for the Advertiser. He has been a newspaper journalist for more than 20 years and has covered a range of assignments, including the Port Arthur Massacre, Thredbo, Snowtown and the Bali Bombings. In 1994 he was awarded the Walkely Award for his coverage of the Hindmarsh Island Bridge Saga. He is the only South Australian journalist to twice be named Justice Reporter of the Year. Colin has received two special citations from the Catholic Archbishop of Adelaide for the promotion of truth, integrity and fairness in South Australia's media. Colin is particularly interested in politics, social justice and the criminal justice system.

Colin is responsible for assigning cases to the various reporters. He apologised for being late this evening but he was finishing a story for the Advertiser, which appeared in Wednesday's paper. He spoke of the story regarding SA's prison system and highlighted that they are presently full and that there are over 250 prisoners extra per day than what the system can accommodate. Therefore the city watch house is currently being used as a remand centre and there the conditions are terrible; no natural light or outside exercise area. There are not enough courtrooms or judges to hear the cases, causing a backlog. Our court system is overstretched and under resourced. Our prisons currently can accommodate 1400 but with 1650 needing to be imprisoned bunks are now being used in some institutions. Colin also spoke on the Bikie situation and raised the issue that there has been movement away from this state of some of the higher profile leaders of the gangs. They have also moved away from prostitution and have gone into money laundering. Colin congratulated the Rann government on the stance they have taken with this group in general.

Another great guest speaker; thank you to the Program Committee for a job well done.
