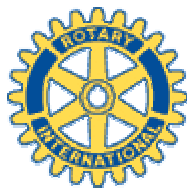

The Rotary Foundation Committee - Stephen Westgarth

The Rotary Foundation Committee has met once since the last Club Assembly. The principal focus of the committee at present is the organisation of the International Night to be held on Wednesday 5th March 2008. It will be a fellowship and fundraising event for The Rotary Foundation. The committee is currently seeking a suitable venue for the event and menu that is international in flavour and agreeable to most palates.

Entertainment for the evening will hopefully comprise music and dance from a variety of national and ethnic origins. Our guest speaker will be Suresh Sunuku, a visiting representative of the Rotary Club of Dharmavaram Mid Town, India, the correspondent club in our recent participation in a matching grant project in India.

The principal fundraising activity will be a raffle to be conducted prior to the event with the draw to be conducted on the night. Another raffle will also be conducted on the night with smaller prizes donated by sponsors. And while ticket prices will be kept as low as possible, they will include a fundraising component.

The committee proposes to invite the other Group 6 clubs and our club's mother, daughter and granddaughter clubs to transfer their meetings to 5th March and join in the International Night and associated fundraising. We will encourage all participating clubs to run their own fundraising raffles prior to the event. Should other clubs decide to participate then we propose to set-up a projects gallery

within the event venue for RCU and participating clubs to display information about their activities and international projects in particular.
