The Rotary Foundation Committee: Stephen Westgarth

Since the last Club Assembly the Rotary Foundation Committee has met by phone and email to conduct its business. The committee's current project is the International Night to be held on Wednesday 5th March 2008 and has been organised by Chandra Sluggett. The theme for the evening will be our club's participation in two matching grants projects in India. This fellowship event will take the form of an alfresco dinner to be set up in the quadrangle of The Orphanage.

Chandra has arranged for us to be entertained by a troupe of young classical Indian dancers. And President David has invited Mr Hieu Van Lee, Chairman of the SA Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs Commission, to nominate a representative with interest in India to speak to us. And we remain hopeful that Suresh Sukunu from the Rotary Club of Dharmavaran Mid Town, India, the correspondent club in our recent participation in a matching grant project in India, will be granted a visa to visit Australia and will also be able to speak to us.

The committee is currently considering entertainment and TRF fundraising options for the next Paul Harris Fellows Recognition Night, although we can say at this stage that entertainment for the evening will hopefully comprise music and dance from a variety of national and ethnic origins.

The principal fundraising activity will be a raffle to be conducted prior to the event with the draw to be conducted on the night. Another raffle will also be conducted on the night with smaller prizes donated by sponsors. And while ticket prices will be kept as low as possible, they will include a fundraising component.

FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE: JERRY CASBURN

Big Fun Day and Fireworks. We are still battling to get a sponsor over the line. David Middleton has kindly offered sponsorship of \$20,000 through Prescott Securities but would clearly prefer that we source independent sponsorship. Currently we have proposals before Telstra and a new Grocery Distribution group called Foodworks. The end of February is really our drop dead point for this year, otherwise there is insufficient runway to get set up in time.

Olive Oil: A label design has been agreed in principle and is being finalised to incorporate the Rotary logo. John Nolan, the label designer, is talking with the production company for the oil.

Thrift Shop: AGL are still processing the application for a concessional electricity rate.

Further work has been completed to improve the shop and facilities. Thanks go mainly to Bob Mullins.

Gross income to 31st January was \$34,530 compared to \$34,221 over the same period last year and \$28,765 the year before.

Thank go to Bob Laws, the committee and volunteers both from Rotary and outside. They do a fabulous job.

Christmas Cakes and Puddings: Janet Singh arranged sales for this year and profits circa \$375 were made. Thanks to Janet and ex-officio Rohan for their efforts.

Entertainment Books: This will be the next cab off the rank.
