Visit to Salvation Army Pirie Street Centre

Major Cameron Wallace welcomed us to the Congress Hall and showed us through parts of the building giving us an insight into the daily activities that are conducted there. Every morning they are greeted with a line of people wanting to access their services and this occurs every day the centre is opened. We were served a dinner of Hotdogs with a choice of sauces and a sandwich along with fruit and tea and coffee. What a great job these people do as this food service occurs 6 nights a week. Other members who are involved in programs gave us an overview and a great insight into the roles they undertake.

The Salvation Army Soup Run commenced in Adelaide in 1990.

Its mission is to "Feed the Homeless in Adelaide" with the purpose of taking opportunities to direct homeless people to organisations which will meet their needs. Volunteers meet at a Whitmore Square premises and prepare food on Monday and Friday nights before proceeding to Gawler place to be met by the homeless. Here such foods as sandwiches, fruit, hot dogs, soup and beverages are served and opportunities are taken by volunteers to talk to the homeless. The van remains at Gawler place for approximately one hour, serving up to 120 clients on Monday nights and up to 60 clients on Friday nights before returning to the Whitmore Square premises to clean up. The soup run works in co-operation with St Vincent de Paul (Fred's van), which operates on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday nights; Coastlands Church covers Saturday night. The three above mentioned soup runs operate at the same site the whole year around. If you wish to volunteer, please ring the Adelaide Salvation Army Corps on (08) 8223 7776.
