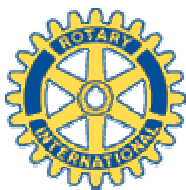

Sergeants Session

The various Sergeants fined several members from each club.

Kaye Challenger - Executive Director of the Marjorie Jackson Nelson Hospital

Chairperson introduced our guest speaker Kaye Challenger who is the Executive Director of the Marjorie Jackson Nelson Hospital Associate Professor Kaye Challenger who is the Director of the MJNH I have had the pleasure of being associated with Kaye for the last 15 or so years through her positions at the Royal Adelaide Hospital. Both Kaye and myself have seen many changes within the health system and we are about to experience another new direction. Kaye was the DON at the RAH in the early 90's progressing to the CEO of the Hospital I think if the internet serves me correctly in the late 90's or 98 to be precise. Kaye was the 1st nurse to hold a position of CEO of a major hospital and it was a great accomplishment. *It was reported in Hansard about Kay's appointment as follows*

Florence Nightingale's influence on the development of nursing is well known by all nurses. One of her significant contributions was establishing the credibility of the nurse in the role of Hospital Administrator, a role now ably performed and recognised by nurses throughout the world. In South Australia, as early as 1864, the role of the nurse was valued at the Adelaide Hospital. The resident surgeon of the day, Dr Spicer, argued that the matron should be given more authority to manage her staff. Indeed, Royal Adelaide Hospital now has a nurse, Kaye Challenger, as its Chief Executive Officer. This is not only a personal success for Kaye but a source of pride for Royal Adelaide Hospital and South Australian nurses. Kaye went to become the ED of the Central Northern Health system which had many hospitals and organizations going through incredible change this includes the QEH Lyell Mc Modbury and the RAH as well as Hampstead and St Margaret's and Glenside What a portfolio. Now Kaye has been appointed to another challenging role as Director of The MJNH. While I don't think I will be a staff member in this hospital, I may possibly be a patient, and how comfortable is it knowing that Kaye is the person in charge.

Kaye highlighted the situation that health is going through with the ageing population and ageing workforce and discussed how the Marjorie Jackson Nelson will deal with these complexities in the hospital situation.

It was a very interesting and topical subject and presentation, prompting many questions from the audience.
