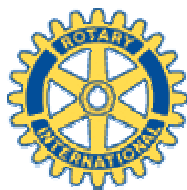

Our Guest Speakers

Jayanti - teacher & coordinator of the Indian Dance School

The Indian dancers' names were Lakshmi (meaning precious), Nitya Lakshmi (meaning abundant wealth), and Ranjani (meaning vibrantly colorful). The three girls, all full-time university students, were introduced by Jayanti (don't know what that means) who is their teacher and choreographer. Jayanti is also a primary school teacher and mother of two; her involvement in Indian dance is a weekend hobby.

Commissioner Promila Gupta:

Promila Gupta came to South Australia from Chandigarh in India, settling first in Whyalla where she started her own restaurant

She moved to Adelaide in 2002 where she has held community positions including Vice President of the Indian Australian Association of South Australia. She is now President of the association. Promila is also a committee member of the Multicultural Education Committee and a presenter of 5EBI-FM's Hindi radio program. Since 2005, she has run Hindi language classes every Sunday. She has been Cultural Coordinator of the Music Club of India. She is Cooking Editor of leading Sydney-based national newspaper "*The Indian Down Under*"; and is Chairperson of the Sargam Indian Musical Association Inc. She has published two cookbooks and last year she won the 'Pride of Australia' Award and 'Citizen of the Year' Award from the City of Campbelltown.

Introduction of Suresh Sunuku:

Suresh Sunuku was born and brought up in Dharmavaram Town in the state of Andhra Pradesh, India. He had his primary and secondary education in the same town and graduated in Science from Gulbarga University in Karnatake. He is the eldest of four children (3 brothers and one sister) and they and his parents all still live together.

Suresh joined Rotary in 1997 and has served the Dharmavaram Mid Town Rotary Club in all capacities including Secretary in 2002-03 (Awarded Best Secretary of the District), and President in 2005-06 (Best President of the District). He held responsible positions in the District from 2002-03 and presently is the District WCS Project Chairman, and will be the Assistant Governor next year. He has a Gents clothing Store, is also a distributor for India's largest Telecommunication network "Reliance in our Town", and are franchisees for the leading cargo company. Suresh has been the General Secretary of the Dharmavaram Consumers' Protection Council since 2000 and Vice President of the Textile and Garments Association of Dharmavaram since 2006. He loves sports and represented his school and college cricket teams and was a good club level cricketer Suresh is happily married to Vani and they have two "wonderful" children; a daughter, Mounika, who is 14yrs old and nicknamed Sweetie, and a son, Sai Sashta Raj, who is 11 yrs old and nicknamed Sunny. Vani and Suresh are proud donors to TRF. Vani is the president of Inner Wheel Club which also provides financial support for Rotary projects.
