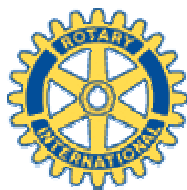

Our Guest Speaker: Sara Hills

"Australian Workplace Agreements: Where are they now?"

John Peacham introduced our guest speaker, Sarah Hills. Sarah has seven years experience in law, both as a practising lawyer and in a corporate capacity. She has a sound understanding of employment law generally and of its practical application in the wine industry having joined the Association in July 2005. This together with her background in property, commercial and local government law arms Sarah with legal expertise across a range of areas of value to the wine industry. Sarah also has experience in providing training, undertaking and dealing with compliance/audit issues and providing legal yet practical advice to relevant stakeholders.

Areas of expertise:

Attendance at the South Australian Industrial Relations Commission with regards to unfair dismissals and State industrial matters affecting members employment practices; Consulting with and / or alerting members about proposed legislation, policy & compliance issues that may affect their wine business operations; Assistance to members with 'live' work place issues: payroll application, occupational health safety and welfare (OHSW), termination, policy development, letters of engagement, co-ordination, preparation and delivery of regional seminars on topical and current issues affecting wine businesses in the areas of employment and OHSW. Visiting regional areas to provide support and assistance to wine industry members in the areas of employment and OHSW; Providing verbal (by telephone and 'face to face') and written advice in relation to interpretation of industrial awards, legislation and agreements relevant to the wine industry.

Sarah gave a very good overview on the changes to the Workplace agreements which are still in place but have changed its format.
