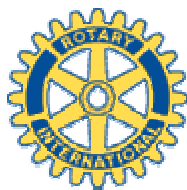

Stephen Baker's Induction 29 April 2008

Stephen Baker was inducted into our club on the evening of the 29th of April 2008. His classification will be: Consulting - Finance and Governance. Stephen has been involved as a member of Rotary since 1998 when he joined the Mandaluyong Rotary Club in Manila. On returning to Adelaide 2001 he joined the Adelaide Light Club and served as President for 2004-5. He went back to Manila in 2005 and rejoined Mandaluyong Rotary Club until 2007. Stephen has now joined Unley. Stephen was born on 30 May 1946 (don't forget the birthday cards).

Professionally:

- Held the lofty position of Environmental Director (but did not solve Manila's chronic pollution);
- Was facility director for budget and governance reforms in the Philippines 2005-2007;
- Undertook domestic and international consulting 2001-2006 in a wide range of areas;
- 1998-2001 on Board of Asian Development Bank;
- 1982-1997 as State MP for Waite, including period in government as Deputy Premier, Treasurer and a number of other portfolios.

Personally: Has been married to Beverley since 1971 with daughters Jacqueline and Celeste [and at latest count, 3 grand-daughters and twin grandsons.... and it does not get any better than that].

Other interests: Golf, Sturt Football Club, OSSAA, Liberal Party.

Our Guest Speaker: Senator Alan Ferguson

Kevin Jaeschke introduced Senator Alan Ferguson. Alan was a former member of the Rotary Club of Maitland and is the brother in law of our member Glenys Ferguson.

Personal Born 16.9.1943, Maitland, SA and Married

Qualifications and occupation before entering federal Parliament: Farm owner and joint manager of farming property 1960-85. Self-employed insurance consultant 1985-92.

Parliamentary service

Chosen by the Parliament of South Australia on 26-5-1992 under section 15 of the Constitution to represent that State in the Senate vice JW Olsen (resigned - term ended 30-6-1993). Elected 1993 (term began 1-7-1993), 1998 and 2004.

Parliamentary Positions: Temporary Chair of Committees from 1.5.96 to 14.8.07; President of the Senate from 14.8.07.

Alan said that his most interesting time was when he was chair of the Foreign Affairs and Defence Trade joint committee. In 2001-2002 he spent time in Zimbabwe which even though it was a bad year for violence it was still a good experience. Alan talked about the political apathy within the community and also expressed his concern about the process of question time.

JOKE OF THE WEEK

FOUR THINGS YOU PROBABLY NEVER KNEW YOUR MOBILE PHONE COULD DO

There are a few things that can be done in times of grave emergencies. Your mobile phone can actually be a lifesaver or an emergency tool for survival. Check out the things that you can do with it:

FIRST: Emergency

The Emergency Number worldwide for Mobile is 112. If you find yourself out of the coverage area of your mobile network and there is an emergency, dial 112 and the mobile will search any existing network to establish the emergency number for you, and interestingly this number 112 can be dialed even if the keypad is locked. Try it out.

SECOND: Have you locked your keys in the car?

Does your car have remote keyless entry? This may come in handy someday. Good reason to own a mobile phone: *If you lock your keys in the car and the spare keys are at home, call someone at home on their mobile phone from your mobile phone.* Hold your mobile phone about a foot from your car door and have the person at your home press the unlock button, holding it near the mobile phone on their end. Your car will unlock. Saves someone from having to drive your keys to you. Distance is no object. You could be hundreds of kilometres away, and if you can reach someone who has the other "remote" for your car, you can unlock the doors (or the boot). Editor's Note: It works fine! We tried it out and it unlocked our car over a mobile phone!"

THIRD: Hidden Battery Power

Imagine your mobile battery is very low. To activate, press the keys *3370# and your mobile will restart with this reserve and the instrument will show a 50% increase in battery. This reserve will get charged when you charge your mobile next time.

FOURTH: How to disable a STOLEN mobile phone?

To check your Mobile phone's serial number, key in the following digits on your phone: *#06#. A 15-digit code will appear on the screen. This number is unique to your handset. Write it down and keep it somewhere safe. When your phone gets stolen, you can phone your service provider and give them this code. They will then be able to block your handset so even if the thief changes the SIM card, your phone will be totally useless. You probably won't get your phone back, but at least you know that whoever stole it can't use/sell it either. If everybody does this, there would be no point in people stealing mobile phones.

This is the kind of information people don't mind receiving, so pass it on to your family and friends
