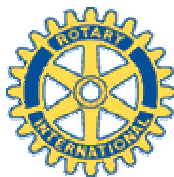

The Rotary Foundation: Stephen Westgarth

This year The Rotary Foundation Committee has had the following objectives:

- ~ To foster understanding within the Club of the role and activities of the Foundation;
- ~ To conduct an International Night to celebrate the club's involvement in international matching grants projects;
- ~ To conduct a Paul Harris Fellows Recognitions Dinner when the work of the Foundation can be celebrated by the awarding of Paul Harris Fellows to Rotarians and members of the public who have made contributions to our community consistent with the goals and ideals of the Foundation; and
- ~ To encourage the donation of money to the foundation, particularly through the Centurion Program.

This Rotary year our International Night was held on 5th March 2008 here at the Old Orphanage, Goodwood. Our guest speaker for the night was S.V. Suresh from the Rotary Club of Dharmavaram Mid-town, India, which is our correspondent club for the matching grant project to provide school uniforms for girls and provide sewing training for women in the Dharmavaram area. We were entertained by three beautiful Indian students who performed several traditional Indian dances and gave us further insight into Indian culture. And we were addressed by Mrs Promila Gupta, a Commissioner for Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs for South Australia. It was a most enjoyable night.

This year's Paul Harris Fellows Recognitions Dinner will be held on 3 June at the House of Zen restaurant, Belair. There will be a Thai theme for the evening consistent with our club's involvement in projects to rebuild and equip a day care centre for children near Chafing Mai, Thailand. The menu will feature Thai dishes and our guest speaker will be John Peacham, who will give us a words and pictures report on the Thailand project. We look forward to seeing as many of our club's Paul Harris Fellows as possible on that night so that we can once again recognise their contributions to our local and international community.

A significant number of our club's members have committed to participation in The Rotary Foundation Centurion Program this year. I am aware of at least eight members who have met their Centurion commitment of contributing \$100 to the foundation each year.

I take this opportunity to recognise the considerable contribution to the work of The Rotary Foundation Committee this year by Chandra Sluggett, who almost single-handedly organised the International Night, and by Janet Singh, a source of great encouragement and energy.

Fundraising Committee Jerry Casburn:

Big Fun Day and Fireworks We did not get the project across the line this year due to our inability to attract sponsors. The Showground have agreed to defer the event to 2009. The committee have agreed that we will pursue sponsorship at a lower dollar value but with more sponsors. The Starlight Foundation are on side with this and we are now about to launch a new programme to attract sponsorship.

Quiz Night Plans will be put together to hold another quiz night.

Olive Oil This project is still progressing and the Board have agreed in principle to support a plan to sell, through Rotary, best quality virgin olive oil. A label design had been established but we have to think again following disagreement between the label designer and the club as to costs.

Thrift Shop Costs have been reduced following the grant of concessional rates from Telstra and other utilities. Gross Income to 31 Gross takings are up over prior years with cumulative takings to April being \$52,401 against \$47,493 last year and \$44656 in the prior year. A morning tea is planned for volunteers on Sunday June 22nd. Thanks must go to Bob Laws and the committee for the dramatic turnaround in fortunes and the running of the shop. It was decided at the last Thrift Shop committee meeting to support Uplift FIJI and donations are asked for bras second hand to be donated.

Entertainment Books Sales targets have been set to 120 books generating a \$1600 profit this year. To date we have recorded sales in excess of 60 books.
