GUEST SPEAKER - Dr Ralph Faggotter: "The Looming Energy Crisis"

During his talk Dr Faggotter talked about the crisis of fuel and pointed out that in 1998 oil was selling for \$10 a barrel and it is now \$138. This then has an effect on all other industries and case increase in fuel process, food travel etc.
