What's New in My Industry – Joan Reed

President Jerry introduced a new segment to our meetings, which he entitled “What's New in My Industry”. Every few weeks a club member will address fellow Rotarians about recent developments and events in their industry and vocation. Our first up speaker was Joan Reed.

Joan provided us with a comprehensive and very informative outline, complete with a PowerPoint presentation, of her work with the Thoracic Unit (previously known as the Chest Clinic) of the Royal Adelaide Hospital. The Thoracic Unit should not be confused with the Sexually Transmitted Diseases Unit next door in North Terrace; Joan only deals with health issues above the waist.

In particular, Joan described her involvement in delivery of health care services in the many areas for which she is responsible. Thank you Joan.

In the first Sergeant's session for the year, Sergeant-at-Arms Bob Laws managed to fine everyone, some more than once. Recently retired Sergeant-at-Arms Greg McLeod won the wine.

Guest Speaker – Frank Bawden

Chairman for the evening, John Russell introduced Frank Bawden from the Rotary Club of Prospect to speak on the subject of “Anzac Commemorations in France”.

Frank recounted the events and his observations of a trip he made to England and France last year with a group of relatives of Australian soldiers who fell during World War I battles on the Western Front, and singers and musicians from Wilderness School and St Peters College. The group participated in commemorations Anzac day in London and at Villers-Bretonneaux in France. Clearly Frank found the whole visit to be a moving experience. He was particularly gratified to see the large number of young Australians participating in the commemorations both at Hyde Park in London.

Frank's story included descriptions of the battlefields and war cemeteries of the Western Front and of the difficulties endured and the courage and initiative displayed by Australian soldiers.

 - e. Any Other Business



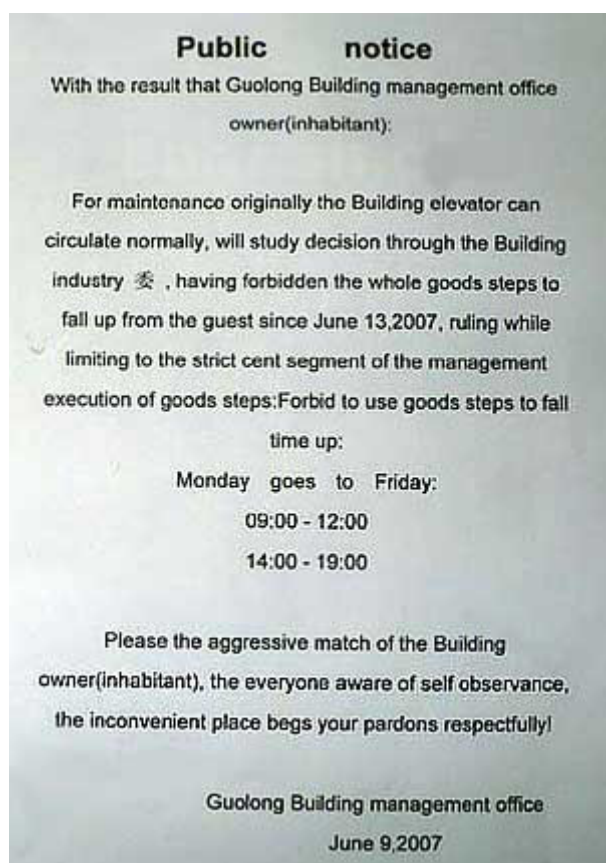
