Rotarian Martin Cooper - Membership Matters

In his capacity of Membership Director, Martin Cooper reported on the Rotary Membership Conference that he recently attended in Canberra. RI President Dong Kurn Lee (he prefers to be called DK) was a keynote speaker at the conference, on four occasions in fact. Martin summarised the points made by RI President DK:

- Integrity and honesty are not negotiable; everything else is!
- I challenge every district to increase their membership by 10% and 2 new clubs!
- It is best when new members are introduced by existing members!
- They don't need to be like-minded friends but people with their own perspectives.
- If we have people that are all like-minded we have stagnation.
- We need diversity to build Rotary.
- Mature Rotarians can impart wisdom gained from experience.
- Young Rotarians can instil youthful energy with insight.
- Rotary is non-secular; in fact it is multi secular!
- More than 50% of the world's population is female; less than 25% of Rotarians are female, we need to address this imbalance!
- We also need to be aware of our ethnicity make up!
- Not surrounded by members only with whom we are comfortable but those from a cross section of the community.
- We must embrace a secular and racial mix to survive.

Guest Speaker - John Pfitzner: "How to Make a Violin"



Chairman for the night, Bob Mullins, introduced John Pfitzner. The second eldest of nine children, John hails from Lameroo; the family moved to Adelaide when John was ten. He won a singing scholarship to Pulteney Grammar School and became Head Chorister at St Peter's Cathedral. He later sang in the State Opera for nine years. John was apprenticed as a cabinetmaker at 15, started his business at 23 and has worked continuously in the furniture manufacturing industry for 52 years. He founded Pfitzner Furniture in 1974 and is still active in his business. John played Amateur League football and is a Past President of Mount Barker football Club. He has been a member of Apex, the Field Master of Adelaide Hunt Club, a Past President of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker where he served for 20 years, and is a Paul Harris Fellow. He has held the posts of Rotaract Representative, served on the District's ACRE Committee and held many positions in his club.

At the age of 21 John married Vivienne and now has two sons, a daughter and four granddaughters and four grandsons.

During his talk John described how he came to be involved in the art of violin making and how it has become a passion, even though he doesn't play. He had brought along a range of violin parts, raw materials, tools and completed violin and cello to illustrate the points he made. Particularly interesting was his story about how Antonio Stradivari went about making his famous "Stradivarius" violins, violas, cellos and basses, the patience required, the skill in selecting the right timbers to use and how he used the local cathedral as a quiet place in which to tune violin sounding boards.

John described the work involved in making each part of a violin, assembling them into a complete instrument and then tuning the instrument to produce the "perfect" sound. The violin and cello he

brought along were made from acacia wood from the Flinders Ranges, which makes those instruments very special indeed. Australian violin virtuoso Jane Peters has played and commented very favourably on the violin John brought along to show us.

Chairman Bob thanked John for presenting a most interesting talk and for taking a number of good questions from members.
