Strategy Plan

Catering: As members are aware there have been a few more negative issues in this area. President Jerry and PE Joan have met with management and catering personnel, resulting in improvements.

To maintain this momentum we need to have a Catering Officer. This is a position that in previous years

was delegated by the President and managed by Club Service. For some reason this did not occur this year. Please, will someone volunteer for this role? There is one simple criteria for this role and we should all be able to meet it, ie preparedness to share in Rotary responsibilities, particularly those that contribute to enjoyable meetings. Time is not a criteria; whether employed or retired we are all busy people.

Website: All club data is current. Suggestions from webmaster Stephen Westgarth for inclusion into the site are:

- Summaries of projects the club has completed, or are currently in place, together with photographs of Rotarians involved
- · Manuals embracing How We Do Projects and Internal Procedures
- These items need to be provided by the board and other club members. The webmaster is not responsible for their preparation prior to website placement

Stephen intends to rebuild the website using his company's Syteware Content Management System. This will enable members to have their own personalised usernames and passwords and update relevant parts of the website.

Risk Management: Peter O'Neil has commenced the assessment phase of this project. Identified areas of risk are the Thrift Shop, outdoor activities, actual Rotary meetings. Any members having concerns about other risk areas should pass these on to Peter ASAP.

Club History: Some members may not be aware that two filing cabinets containing club history were relocated from Bob Mills home to the Thrift Shop about four months ago. One cabinet contains irreplaceable data and is locked. Bob maintains responsibility for history maintenance and has the key for the locked cabinet.

- Tepsadej Wittaya School Library and Teaching equipment Project, Chiang Mai RC, Thailand D3360 (cont. 08/09 project): Awaiting TRF to confirm funding status of the project.
- Bore well Project RC of Dharmavaram Mid Town, India, District 3160. (cont. 08/09 project): District has cleared its breach with TRF and we will consider recommencing this project.
- Water Treatment Project Philippines This is a combined Districts, States and International Project involving Districts 9500, 9520, 9800, 9810 & D3830. It is seeking each club to pledge minimum \$1,000 to respective Districts until \$20,000 per District is reached. We will Pledge \$1,000.

Vocational & New Generations Report - Stephen Baker

Police Officer of the Year: Police have agreed to have a POOTY medal and 3 designs are in the process of being submitted for the Commissioners approval; if it proceeds we would need to present medals to past winners (opportunity for a big occasion).

The Police not keen on outside sponsorship (may conflict/diminish with their own sponsorship efforts); neither of us want any monetary benefit to flow to the winner; we would not wish to add sponsors names to our trophies......reported difficulties with previous Advertiser arrangement.

Police Commissioner would wish to have the categories for POOTY widened to include service effectiveness Last year the publicity was adversely affected by the Federal Budget - this year POOTY will be a week earlier. Special effort is to be made with the Advertiser and Messenger papers

RYLA, RYPEN, NYSF, Science Forums: Rypen, NYSF and the Summer Science Forums rely on contacts with Walford and Annesley. Discussions have been held with both Heads who are positive about

Rotary...NYSF is attractive but Rypen and the Science Forum less so. Effort will be made to widen RYLA recruitment this year **Indigenous Medical Scholarships:** The club and Dr Helen Sage will continue to support Lauren Sperring. We have asked for a new student in 2010 to replace Natalie Moore but are not overly hopeful because the scheme is experiencing difficulties

Youth Exchange: Need for a reminder to all club members to support Leena and Joan.

Campbelltown Shareskills Inc: About \$5000 in interest available from the CSI Trust Fund to assist unemployed. A scheme in conjunction with the Salvos was being finalized when its contract was lost earlier this year; another attempt is to be launched in 2010 Trade Schools for the Future: Mentoring arrangements are to change. The new Federal Government scheme will assist the least able. We will explore opportunities to participate.

Unley Traders: Next open meeting is at 6pm on Tuesday December 8 at Unley Council chambers (problem is that they always meet at same time as Rotary); a club presence is being organized.
